Item rate e-bids are invited through the e-biding Gem portal by Sr. Manager (E-E), Airports Authority of India, Aurangabad Airport, Aurangabad (Bid Manager) on behalf of Chairman, AAI from the eligible contractors for the work of "Deployment of Facility Maintenance Contract (FMC) for Airport Systems facilities at Aurangabad Airport for the two years from 2024-26." at an estimated cost of Rs. 67,10,771.00 (including GST) with completion period of Twenty Four (24) Months.

The biding process is online at GEM-portal URL address https://gem.gov.in. Prospective Bidders may download and go through the bid document. Aspiring bidders may download and go through the bid document. Aspiring bidders may go through the bid document by login the GeM portal. The bids will not be accepted in any other form.

Any amendment or corrigendum to the bid document will be posted on GeM Portal only. As the biding process is online on GeM portal, it is bidders" responsibility to check for any amendment / corrigendum on GeM Portal before submitting the bid online on GeM portal. Also, the bidders are advised to get themselves acquainted with the e- biding process on GeM portal which requires registration at GeM portal, obtain "User ID" & "Password" and go through the "Bid for Services – Service Provider side" available in the home page after login to the GeM portal http://gem.gov.in.

Bidders shall submit their bids as per scheduled date and time through Gem-procurement portal at http://gem.gov.in only.

GeM portal -procurement system shall not allow bidders to submit their bid, after the scheduled date and time. Bidders shall submit bid before the schedule deadline specified in GeM bid document or the extended deadline notified by issue of corrigendum, as the case may be.

Proprietary firm shall submit scanned copy of Authorization Letter / Power of Attorney only if the bid is processed by a person other than proprietor.

B. Qualifying requirements of contractors / bidder s containing the following:

- A. Should have satisfactorily completed (# Phase/Part completion of the scope of work in a contract shall not be considered, however pre-determined phasing of the work will be accepted) three works, each of Rs. 13,42,154.00 (i/c GST) or two works, each of Rs.16,77,693.00 (i/c GST) or one work of Rs. 26,84,308.00 (i/c GST) in single contract of similar nature of work "O&M/AMC/CMC of Electrical/ Electronics installations including allied works related to passenger terminal building/passenger facilitation/Airport Security at Airport" along with work order & schedule and completion certificate" during last seven years ending on last day of month previous to the one in which bidare invited.
- B. The similar nature of work for eligibility requirement as above must be completed of minimum one year. Assessment of eligibility shall be based on the completed cost for one-year calculation on pro-rata basis for completed works of more than one-year time period. The details of similar nature of the works completed during last seven years.

Note:

- The Experience Certificates of works completed pre-GST era; Completion amount will be divided by 1.12 (to exclude pre-GST taxes) to make it at par with experience certificates of post GST era but excluding GST.
- The Bids invited for Annual Rate Contracts for O&M / AMC works; the works experience
 may be counted for the value of work for a completed one year on pro-rata basis to
 prequalify agency that has completed one year of AMC but work is still not completed due
 to longer period of AMC.

- 3. Experience gained by executing work on back-to-back contract/ Sub-contract basis is acceptable in the following conditions:
 - a) Work should be actually executed by the second agency (sub-contractor) with due concurrence of the owner as tripartite agreement/ written approval. It should be backed by valid agreement and experience certificate.
 - b) Payments received by second agency should be reflected in TDS certificates.
- C. Experience gained in composite works for the specialized nature of works (List of Specialized Items / Jobs / Works are mentioned at Para 35.3 of AAI Works Manual) were executed by main contractor either by in-house expertise & experience or by engaging the specialized agencies with the approval of main client as per contract conditions. In such cases, main contractor as well as specialized agency both get the experience certificate for the same work from their respective client(s) i.e., main contractor for composite work along with specialized works from owner and specialized agency for specialized work(s) from the main contractor.

In this situation, the experience certificate of either specialized agency or main agency having in-house expertise & experience, who has actually executed the specialized work(s), shall be considered for Technical /Pre-qualifying criteria in similar specialized nature of work(s).

"The value of executed works shall be brought to current costing level by enhancing the actual value of work at simple rate of 7% per annum, calculated from the date of completion to the last date of submission of bid".

Client certificate for experience should show the nature of work done, the value of work done, date of start, date of completion as per agreement, actual date of completion and satisfactory completion of work. Bidders showing work experience certificate from non-government/non-PSU organizations should submit copy of tax deduction at sources (TDS) certificate along with a certificate issued by registered Chartered Accountant, clearly specifying the name of work, total payment received against work and TDS amount for the work.

(i) Should have annualized average financial turnover of Rs. 10,06,616.00 (i/c GST) on construction works during last three years ending 31st March of the previous financial year. The financial information shall be submitted in the given format in the Bid Document. Bidder showing continuous losses for the last three years in the balance sheet shall be summarily rejected. (Bidder As a proof, copy of Abridged Balance Sheet along with Profit and Loss Account Statement of the firm should be submitted along with the application). Bidder s have to submit UDIN generated documents likebalance sheet / turn over certificate, working capital certificate (work done during last 5 year financial years & work in hand), net worth certificate, Tax deduction at source (TDS) certificates for Non- govt. works etc. as per NIT conditions duly certified by CA and having UDIN. The documents submitted by bidders without UDIN shall not be entertained.

(ii) The bidder should have minimum net worth of **Rs. 5,03,308.00 (i/c GST)** issued by certified Chartered Accountant. The certificate should be submitted in the given format- **Form-C of Bid Document.** Bidders have to submit UDIN generated documents duly certified by CA and having UDIN. The documents submitted by bidders without UDIN shall not be entertained.

Scanned copy of all the Document of Envelope-I mentioned above shall be submitted on the GEM portal.

Envelope-II: - (Financial Bid): The Financial e-Bid through Gem Portal.

All rates shall be quoted in the format provided and no other format is acceptable. If the price bid has been given as standard BOQ format with the bid document, then the same is to be downloaded and to be filled by all the Bidders. Bidders are required to download the BOQ file, open it and complete the cells with their respective financial quotes and other details (such as name of the Bidder s). Once the details have been completed, the Bidder s should save it and submit it online, without changing the filename. If the BOQ file is found to be modified by the bidder, the bid will be rejected.

D. Refund of EMD:

EMD amount of the rejected bidders will be refunded to their source account after submission of Technical / Financial evaluation report on Gem Portal by bid manager.

E. <u>Bid Submission:</u>

The bidder shall submit their application only at **Gem Portal:** https://gem.gov.in **Bidder / Contractor** are advised to follow the instruction provided in the bid document for online submission of bids. Bidder s are required to upload the digitally signed file of scanned documents as per Para2. Bid documents may be scanned with 100 dpi with black and white option which helps in reducing size of the scanned document.

Uploading of application in location other than specified above shall not be considered. Hard copy of application shall not be entertained.

- F. Not more than one bid shall be submitted by one bidder or bidder s having business relationship. Under no circumstance will father and his son(s) or other close relations who have business relationship with one another (i.e. when one or more partner(s)/director(s) are common) be allowed to bid for the same contract as separate competitors. A breach of this condition will render the bids of both parties liable to rejection.
- G. Bidder who has downloaded the bid from Gem Portal website https://gem.gov.in, shall not tamper/modify the bid form including downloaded price bid template in any manner. In case if the same is found to be tampered / modified in any manner, bid will be completely rejected and EMD would be forfeited and bidder is liable to be banned from doing business with AAI.

H. Bids Opening Process is as below:

Envelope-I: (Technical bid and Pre-qualification):

Envelope-I containing document as per Para 2(A) and (B) (uploaded by the bidder s) shall be opened on date & time mentioned in CRITICAL DATA SHEET.

If the bidder has any query related to the Bid Document of the work, they should use "Seek Clarification" on GEM portal to seek clarifications. No other means of communication in this regard shall be entertained.

If any clarification is needed from the bidder about the deficiency in his uploaded documents in Envelope-I, he will be asked to provide it through Gem Portal or email, if required. The bidder shall upload the requisite clarification/documents within time specified by AAI, failing which it shall be presumed that bidder does not have anything to submit and bid shall be evaluated accordingly.

The intimation regarding acceptance / rejection of their bid will be intimated to the bidder s through Gem Portal.

Envelope-II: (Financial Bid):

Envelope-II containing financial bid of the bidders found to be meeting the technical criteria and qualifying requirements shall be opened on date & time mentioned in CRITICAL DATA SHEET. (In case the date and time for opening of Envelope-II (Financial Bid) is required to be changed, the same shall be intimated through Gem Portal).

- I. AAI reserves the right to accept or reject any or all applications without assigning any reasons. AAI also reserves the right to call off bid process at any stage without assigning any reason.
- J. AAI reserves the right to disallow the working agencies whose performance at ongoing project(s) is below par and unusually poor and has been issued letter of restrain / Temporary /Permanent debarment/black listing by any department of AAI or Central/State Govt. Depts./PSUs/World Bank/ ADB etc. AAI reserves the right to verify the credential submitted by the bidder at any stage (before or after the award of the work). If at any stage, any information / documents submitted by the applicant is found to be incorrect / false or have some discrepancy which disqualifies the bidder then AAI shall take the following action:
 - a) Forfeit the entire amount of EMD submitted by the bidder.
 - b) The bidder shall be liable for debarment from biding in AAI, including termination of the contract apart from any other appropriate contractual/legal action.
- K. Consortium /JV companies shall not be permitted.

- L. Purchase preference to Central Public sector Undertaking shall be applicable as per the directive of Govt. of India prevalent on the date of acceptance.
- M. Concessions to Indian Micro & Small Enterprises (MSEs) units registered with DIC / NSIC / KVIC / KVIB / Directorate of Handicraft and Handloom etc., to be given as per the provisions of Public Procurement Policy for MSEs order 2012 with up-to-date amendments, shall be applicable for bids of supply/services and shall not be extended to construction work. However, if the agency is registered in the category other than the relevant category of the bid, the agency mayparticipate as general bidder in the bid.
- N. Bidders have to submit Unique Document Identification Number (UDIN) generated documents like Balance Sheet / Turnover certificate, Working Capital Certificate (works done during last 5 financial years & works in hand), Net worth Certificate, Tax Deduction at Source (TDS) Certificate for Non-Govt. works etc. as per NIT conditions duly certified by CA and having UDIN. The documents submitted by bidders without UDIN shall not be entertained.

- 1. Item rate bids are invited through the Gem Portal https://gem.gov.in. by Sr. Manager (E- E), Airports Authority of India, Aurangabad Airport, Aurangabad on behalf of chairman, AAI, for the work "Deployment of Facility Maintenance Contract (FMC) for Airport Systems facilities at Aurangabad Airport for the two years from 2024-26." at an estimated cost and completion period as per e-NIT Sr. No. 1 (Page- 1).
- 2. The bids shall be in the prescribed Form, are invited in two bid system:
 - i. **Envelope-I:** Containing scanned copy of EMD, Technical Bidand Pre-qualification all the criteria mentioned in E-Bid.
 - ii. Envelope-II: The Financial e-Bid through Gem Portal.
- 3. **Time limit:** As per e-NIT Sr. No. 1 (Page No. 1)
- 4. Not more than one bid shall be submitted by a contractor or by a firm. Not more than one concern in which an individual is interested, as proprietor and/or partner shall bid for the execution of the same work. If they do so, all such bids shall be liable to be rejected.
- 5. The Accepting Authority as mentioned in **Schedule "F"/2 (viii)**, shall be the accepting officer hereinafter, referred to as such for the purpose of this contract.
- 6. In the event of the bid being submitted by a firm, it must be signed separately by each partner thereof or in the event of the absence of any partner it must be signed on his behalf by a person holding a power-of attorney authorizing him to do so. Such power of attorney to be uploaded with the bid, and it must disclose that the firm I duly registered under the Indian partnership Act, 1952.
- 7. Bid documents consisting of specifications, Schedule of quantities of the work conditions of contract and other necessary documents has to be uploaded in Gem Portal https://gem.gov.in. Bid document can be downloaded from the Gem Portal. EMD is to be paid through as mentioned page no. 02 only.
- 8. Copies of other drawings and documents pertaining to the works signed for the purpose of identification by the Accepting Officer or his accredited representative will be available at Gem Portal itself.

- 9. Bidders are advised to inspect and examine the site and its surroundings and satisfy themselves before submitting their Bids as to the nature of the ground and sub soil (so far as is practicable), the nature of the site, the means of access to the site, the accommodation they may require, working conditions including space for stacking of materials, installation of T&P, rates of various materials to be incorporated in works, conditions affecting accommodation and movement of labours etc. and in general shall themselves obtain all necessary information as to risks, contingencies and other circumstances which may influence or effect their Bid. A Bidder shall be deemed to have full knowledge of the site whether he inspects it or not and no extra charges consequent on any misunderstanding or otherwise shall be allowed.
- 10. Submission of a Bid by a Bidder implies that he has read this notice and all other contract documents and has made himself aware of the scope and specifications of the works to be done and of conditions and rates at which land for stores, tools and plant, etc. will be arranged by contractor.
- 11. All rates shall be quoted in the format provided on Gem Portal and no other format is acceptable.
- 12. As this bid is an Item rate Bid, rates for all items quoted shall only be considered. Any Bid containing percentage below/above the total estimated cost is liable to be rejected. Bidder s which propose any alteration in the works specified in the said form of invitation to bid, or in the time allowed for carrying out the work, or which contain any other conditions of any sort including conditional rebates will be summarily rejected. Any Bid containing percentage below/above the rates quoted is liable to be rejected.
- 13. Bids shall be received through Gem Portal upto the date and time as mentioned at page no. 2 as per e-NIT and shall be opened on the date and time as mentioned at page no. 2 of e-NIT. Any change or extension of date shall be intimated through e- biding portal.
- 14. EMD amount as mentioned at Page no. 2 of e-NIT shall be accepted online only.
- 15. Notification of Award of contract will be made in writing to the successful bidder by the Accepting Authority or his representative. The contract will normally be awarded to the qualified and responsive Bidder offering lowest evaluated bid in conformity with the requirements of the specifications and contract documents and the Accepting Authority shall be the sole judge in this regard. The Accepting Authority does not bind himself to accept the lowest or, any bid or to give any reason for his decision. Responsive

bidder is one who submits priced Bid and accepts all terms, conditions and specifications of the contract documents.

A major modification is one which affects in any way the quality, quantity and period of completion of the work or which limits in any way the responsibilities or liabilities of the Bidder or any right of AAI, as required in the specifications and contract documents. Any modification in the terms and conditions of the Bid which are not acceptance to AAI shall also be treated as a major modification.

Bidder shall submit a responsive bid, failing which his Bid will be liable to be rejected.

- 16. The Accepting Authority reserves to himself the right of accepting the whole or any part of the Bid and Bidder shall be bound to perform the same at his quoted rates. No claim whatsoever will be entertained on this account.
- 17. On acceptance of Bid, "Earnest Money Deposit" will be treated as part of the security deposit as per Clause 1 A of GCC.
- 18. Airports Authority of India shall return the earnest money where applicable to every unsuccessful Bidder except as provided in the Bid documents.
- 19. Canvassing in connection with Bids is strictly prohibited and the Bids submitted by the Bidder s who resort to canvassing will be liable to be rejected.
- 20. The Bid shall not be permitted to bid for works in Airports Authority of India Engineering Department, responsible for award and execution of contracts, in which his near relative is posted as Manager Finance & Accounts or Sr. Officer or as an engineer in any capacity. He shall also intimate the names of persons who are working with him in any capacity or are subsequently employed by him and who are near relative to any officer in Airports Authority of India. Any breach of this condition by the contractor would render him liable to be debarred from Biding for next 2 years.
- 21. No Engineer of Gazetted rank or other Gazetted Officer employed in Engineering or Administrative duties in an Engineering Department of Airports Authority of India/Govt. of India is allowed to work as a contractor for a period of two years of his retirement from Airports Authority of India/Government service, without the previous permission of Airports of India/Govt. of India. The contract is liable to be cancelled if either the contractor or any of his employees is found at any time to be such a person who had not obtained the permission of Airports Authority of India/Govt. of India as aforesaid before submission of the Bid or engagement in the contractor service.

- 22. The Bid for the work shall remain open for acceptance for a period of **Ninety days** from the actual date of opening of financial bid. If any Bidder withdraws his Bid before the said period or makes any modifications in the terms and conditions of the Bid which are not acceptable to the Department, then Airports Authority of India shall without prejudice to any other right or remedy, be at liberty **to forfeit the full said** earnest money absolutely / initiate actions as per bid conditions.
- 23. On acceptance of the Bid, the name of the accredited representative(s) of the contractor who would be responsible for taking instructions from the Engineer-in- Charge shall be communicated to the Engineer-in-Charge.
- 24. A bidder shall submit the bid which satisfies each and every condition laid down in this notice failing which the Bid will be liable to be rejected. Also if the credential submitted by the firm found to be incorrect or have some discrepancy which disqualifies the firm then the AAI shall take the following action:
 - i. Forfeit the entire amount of EMD submitted by the firm.
 - ii. The bidder shall be liable for debarment from biding in AAI, including termination of the contract apart from any other appropriate contractual / legal action.
- 25. All bided rates shall be inclusive of any taxes, duties, fee, royalty charges etc. leviedunder any statute and also inclusive of Goods & Services Tax (GST) as per terms and conditions of the contract.
 - Statutory deductions i.e. Income tax, TDS etc. will be deducted at the time of making payment of running account bill/final bill as applicable as per government law during payment made to the Contractor. Nothing extra will be paid by AAI in this respect also Security Deposit @ 10 % shall be deducted which shall be returned after successful completion of DLP period.
- 26. a. All bided rates shall be inclusive of all taxes and levies including of GST. However, in case of change rate of tax or any provision relating to the levy to Tax resulting in increased burden of Tax on the contractor, the contractor shall be entitled to receive any compensation for such increase in quantum of Tax payable by the contractor. Similarly, recovery shall be made from the contractor on account of decrease of rate of Tax or any provision relating to levy of Tax.

- **b.** The contractor shall keep necessary books of accounts and other documents for the purpose of this condition as may be necessary and shall allow inspection of the same by a duly authorized representative of Airports Authority of India and / or Engineer-In-Charge and further shall furnish such other information / document as the Engineer-In-Charge may require from time to time.
- 27. The site for the work is available & shall be handed over in phase manner.

28. MODE OF SUBMISSION OF BIDS:

- i. Bid for the work shall be submitted online through Gem Portal in open bid two envelope system as detailed in e-NIT (Page -1 to Page-7).
- ii. Once the contractor has uploaded the digitally signed unconditional acceptance as an attachment, he is not permitted to upload any additional file or put any remark(s)/conditions(s) in / along with the Bid Document.
- iii. In case, the condition 28 (ii) above are found violated, the bid shall be rejected and 10% of the EMD amount shall be forfeited.
- iv. This Notice Inviting Bid shall form part of the contract documents. The successful Bidder /contractor, on acceptance of his Bid by the Accepting Authority, shall within 10-days from the date of award of work sign the contract consisting of Notice inviting Bids, General conditions of contract, special/additional condition, General and particular specifications, drawings, Bid conditions as issued at the time of invitation of Bid and acceptance thereof with any correspondence leading there to.

29. PROCEDURE FOR OPENING OF BID: -

Envelope-II: - Date of opening of Envelope – II (Financial Bid) shall be intimated to the eligible bidders through Gem Portal.

30. Refund of EMD

EMD amount of the rejected bidders will be refunded to their source/address after submission of Technical/Financial evaluation report on Gem Portal by bid manager.

31 Rejection of Bid

In case the contractor fails to deposit performance guarantee within the stipulated period, no payment will be released to the contractor for the work done in respect of 1st running account bill. Such deductions will be made and held by AAI by way of Security Deposit unless he/they has/have deposited the amount of Security at the rate mentioned above in the form of Bank Guarantee (including e-Bank Guarantee) from any of the Commercial Bank (i.e. Indian or Foreign Banks included in the Second Schedule of Reserve Bank of India Act,1934 excluding Co-Operative/Regional Rural Banks). In case a Guarantee Bonds of any Bank is furnished by the contractor to the AAI as part of the security deposit and the Bank is unable to make payment against the said Guarantee Bond, the loss caused thereby shall fall on the contractor and the contractor shall forthwith on demand furnish additional security to the AAI to make good the deficit. In works where condition of submission of performance guarantee is not applicable, the security deposit atthe rate of 10% (Ten Percent) of gross amount of each running bill shall be deducted instead of 5%, till the sum will amount to security deposit of 10% of the contract value of work. Other conditions shall remain same as stated above.

All compensations or the other sums of money payable by the contractor under the terms of this contract may be deducted from, or paid by the sale of a sufficient part of his security deposit or from the interest arising therefrom, or from any sums which may be due to or may become due to the contractor by AAI on any account whatsoever and in the event of his Security Deposit being reduced by reason of any such deductions or sale as aforesaid, the contractor shall within 10 days make good in Fixed Deposit Receipt, Insurance Surety Bonds, Account Payee Demand Draft or Bank Guarantee from any of the Commercial Bank (if deposited for more than 12 months) endorsed in favour of the Airports Authority of India, any sum or sums which may have been deducted from, or raised by sale of his security deposit or any part thereof. The security deposit shall be collected from the running bills and the final bill of the contractor at the rates mentioned abovehe contract value of work. Other conditions shall remain same as stated above.

The security deposit as deducted above can be released against Bank Guarantee issued by any Commercial Bank (i.e. Indian or Foreign Banks included in the Second Schedule of Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934 excluding Co-Operative /Regional Rural Banks), on its accumulations to a minimum of Rs. 5 lakh to the condition amount of such bank guarantee, except last one, shall not be less than Rs. 5 lakh. Note 1: Provided further that the validity of Bank Guarantee shall be in conformity with provisions contained in the clause 17 which shall be extended from time to time depending upon extension of contract under provision of Clause 2 & Clause 5.

The amount of compensation may be adjusted or set-off against any sum payable to the' Contractor under this or any other contract with AAI. In case, the contractor does not achieve a particular milestone mentioned in schedule F, or the re-scheduled milestone(s) in terms of Clause 5.4, the amount shown against that milestone shall be withheld, to be adjusted against the compensation levied as above. With-holding of this amount on failure to achieve a milestone, shall be automatic without any notice to the contractor. However, if the contractor catches up with the progress of work on the subsequent milestone(s), the withheld amount shall be released. In case the contractor fails to make up for the delay in subsequent milestone(s), amount mentioned against each milestone missed subsequentlyalsoshallbewithheld. However, no interest, what so ever, shall be payable on such withheld amount.

5. Incentive for early completion

In case, the contractor completes the work ahead of stipulated date of completion so provided in 'Schedule F', a bonus @ 1 % (one per cent) of the tendered value per month computed on per day basis, shall be payable to the contractor, subject to a maximum limit of 5% (five per cent) of the tendered value. The amount of bonus, if payable, shall be paid along with final bill after completion of work. Bonus/ Incentive shall be applicable for the contract completed before stipulated dated of completion and shall not be applicable for the contract extended beyond the stipulated period even with justified hindrance and without any action of compensation for delay.

This clause shall not be applicable for the works which estimated cost put to tender is less than Rs. 50.00 Cr.

Clause2B

Release of withheld amount against compensation for delay. Withheld amount towards compensation for delay over and above Rs. 50.00 lacs, can be released against Bank Guarantee (on the format given at Appendix-1) or in the form of fixed deposit receipts or guarantee bonds of any Scheduled Bank but not Co-operative or Gramin Bank, pending finalization of case of extension of time by competent authority as per delegation of powers. Concerned Executive Director (Eng.) will authorize such action on receipt of proposal from the Engineer-In-Charge through proper channel.

Subject to other provisions contained in this clause, the Engineer-in-Charge may, without prejudice to his any other rights or remedy against the contractor in respectofanydelay,inferiorworkmanship,anyclaimsfordamagesand/oranyother provisions of this contract or otherwise, and whether the date of completion hasorhasnotelapsed,bynoticeinwritingabsolutelydeterminethecontractin



any of the following cases:

- i. If the contractor having been given a notice by the Engineer-in-Charge in writing to rectify, reconstruct or replace any defective work or that the work is being performed in an inefficient or otherwise improper or un-workman like manner shall omit to comply with the requirement of such notice for a period of seven days thereafter.
- **ii.** If the contractor has, without reasonable cause, suspended the progress of the work or has failed to proceed with the work with due diligence and continues to do so after a notice in writing of seven days from the Engineer- in-Charge.
- iii. If the contractor fails to complete the work or section of work with individual date of completion on or before the stipulated or justified extended date on or before such date of completion, and the Engineer in Charge without any prejudice to any other right or remedy under any other provision in the contract has given further reasonable time in a notice given in writing in that behalf as either mutually agreed or in absence of such mutual agreement by his own assessment making such time essence of contract and in the opinion of Engineer in Charge, the contractor will be unable to complete the same or does not complete the same within the period specified.
- **iv.** If the contractor persistently neglects to carry out his obligations under the contract and / or commits default in complying with any of the terms and conditions of the contract and does not remedy it or take effective steps to remedy it within 7 days after a notice in writing is given to him in that behalf by the Engineer-in-Charge.
- **v.** If the contractor shall offer or give or agree to give to any person in AAI service or to any other person on his behalf any gift or consideration of any kind as an inducement or reward for doing or forbearing to do or for having done or forborne to do any act in relation to the obtaining or execution of this or any other contract for AAI.
- vi. If the contractor shall enter into a contract with Airports Authority of India in connection with which commission has been paid or agreed to be paid by him or to his knowledge, unless the particulars of any such commission and the terms of payment thereof have been previously disclosed in writing to the Engineer-in-charge.
- **vii.** If the contractor shall obtain a contract with AAI as a result of wrong tendering or other non-bonafide methods of competitive tendering or commits any breach of Integrity Pact.
- viii. If the contractor being an individual, or if a firm, any partner thereof shall at any time be adjudged insolvent or have a receiving order or order for administration of his estate made against him or shall take any proceedings for liquidation or composition (other than a voluntary liquidation for the purpose of amalgamation or reconstruction) under any Insolvency Act for the time being in force or make any conveyance or assignment of his effects or composition or arrangement for the benefit of his creditors or purport so to do, or if any application be made under any Insolvency Act for the time being in force for the sequestration of his estate or if a trust deed be executed by him for benefit of his creditors.
- ix. If the contractor being a company shall pass a resolution or the court shall make an order that the company shall be wound up or if a receiver or a manager on behalf of a creditor shall be appointed or if circumstances shall arise which entitle the court or the creditor to appoint a receiver or a manager or which entitle the court to make a winding up order.
- **x.** If the contractor shall suffer an execution being levied on his goods and allow it to be continued for a period of 21days.



- xi. If the contractor assigns (excluding part(s) of work assigned to other agency(s) by the contractor as per terms of contract), transfers, sublets (engagement of Labor on a piece-work basis or of Labor with materials not to be incorporated in the work, shall not be deemed to be subletting) or otherwise parts with or attempts to assign, transfer, sublet or otherwise parts with the entire works or any portion thereof without the prior written approval of the Engineer-in-Charge. When the contractor has made himself liable for action under any of the cases aforesaid, the Engineer-in-Charge on behalf of the Chairman, AAI shall have powers:
 - a. To determine the contract as aforesaid so far as performance of work by the Contractor of work is concerned (of which determination notice in writing to the contractor under the hand of the Engineer-in-Charge shall be conclusive evidence). Upon such determination, the Earnest Money Deposit, Security Deposit already recovered and Performance Guarantee under the contract shall be liable to be forfeited and shall be absolutely at the disposal of the AAI.
 - After giving notice to the contractor to measure up the work of the contractor and to take such whole, or the balance or part thereof, as shall be un-executed out of his hands and to give it to another contractor or any other means to complete the work. The contractor, whose contract is determined as above, shall not be allowed to participate in the tendering process for the balance work. In the event of above courses being adopted by the Engineer-in-Charge, the contractor shall have no claim to compensation for any loss sustained by him by reasons of his having purchased or procured any materials or entered into any engagements or made any advances on account or with a view to the execution of the work or the performance of the contract. And in case action is taken under any of the provision aforesaid, the contractor shall not be entitled to recover or be paid any sum for any work thereof or actually performed under this contract unless and until the Engineer-in-Charge has certified in writing the performance of such work and the value payable in respect there of and he shall only been titled to be paid the value so certified.

CLAUSE 3 A

In case, the work cannot be started due to reasons not within the control of the contractor within 1/8th of the stipulated time for completion of work or one month whichever is higher, either party may close the contract by giving notice to the other party stating the reasons. In such eventuality, the Earnest Money Deposit and the Performance Guarantee of the contractor shall be refunded within 30 days.

Neither party shall claim any compensation for such eventuality. This clause is not applicable for any breach of the contract by either party.



CLAUSE4

Contractor liable to pay compensation even if action not taken under Clause-3

In any case in which any of the powers conferred upon the Engineer-in-Charge by Clause-3 thereof, shall have become exercisable and the same are not exercised, the non-exercise thereof shall not constitute a waiver of any of the conditions hereof and such powers shall notwithstanding be exercisable in the event of any future case of default by the contractor and the liability of the contractor for compensation shall remain unaffected. In the event of the Engineer-in-Charge putting in force all or any of the powers vested in him under the preceding clause he may, if he so desires after giving a notice in writing to the contractor, take possession of (or at the sole discretion of the Engineer-in-Charge which shall be final and binding on the contractor) use as on hire (the amount of the hire money being also in the final determination of the Engineer-in-Charge) all or any tools, plant, materials and stores, in or upon the works, or the site thereof belonging to the contractor, or procured by the contractor and intended to be used for the execution of the work/ or any part thereof, paying or allowing for the same in account at the contract rates, or, in the case of these not being applicable, at current market rates to be certified by the Engineer-in-Charge, whose certificate thereof shall be final, and binding on the contractor, clerk of the works, foreman or other authorised agent to remove such tools, plant, materials, or stores from the premises (within a time to be specified in such notice) in the event of the contractor failing to comply with any such requisition, the Engineerin-Charge may remove them at the contractor's expense or sell them by auction or private sale on account of the contractor and his risk in all respects and the certificate of the Engineer-in-Charge as to the expenses of any such removal and the amount of the proceed sand expenses of any such sale shall be final and conclusive against the contractor.

PROGRAMME CHART

- i. The Contractor shall prepare an integrated programme chart in Project Management Software for the execution of work, showing clearly all activities from the start of work to completion, with details of manpower, equipment and machinery required for the fulfillment of the programme within the stipulated period or earlier and submit the same for approval to the Engineer-in- Charge within fifteen days of award of the contract. A recovery of Rs. 2500/- (for works costing upto Rs. 5.00 Crores) / Rs. 5000/- (for works costing more than Rs. 5.00 Crores) shall be made on per day basis in case of delay in submission of the above programme.

The contractor shall submit shuttering schedule adequate to complete structure work within laid down physical milestone.

the format of the department so that a complete record is obtained of all the items of works performed under the contract.

All such measurements and levels recorded by the contractor or his authorized representative from time to time, during the progress of the work, shall be got checked by the contractor from the Engineer-in-Charge or his authorized representative as per interval or program fixed in consultation with Engineer-in-Charge or his authorized representative. After the necessary corrections made by the Engineer-in-Charge, the measurement sheets shall be returned to the contractor for incorporating the corrections and for resubmission to the Engineer-in-Charge for the dated signatures by the Engineer-in-Charge and the contractor or their representatives in token of their acceptance.

Whenever bill is due for payment, the contractor would initially submit draft computerized measurement sheets and these measurements would be got checked/test checked *from* the Engineer-in-Charge and/or his authorized representative. If at all any error is noticed, the contractor shall have to submit a fresh computerized MB with its pages duly machine numbered and bound, after getting the earlier MB cancelled by the department. Thereafter, the MB shall be taken in the records of Engineer-in-charge, and allotted a number as per the Register of Computerized MBs. This should be done before the corresponding bill is submitted to the Engineer-in-charge for payment. The contractor shall submit two spare copies of such computerized MB's for the purpose of reference and record by the various officers of the department.

The contractor shall also submit to the department separately his computerized Abstract of Cost and the bill based on these measurements, duly bound, and its pages machine numbered along with two spare copies of the "bill. One lac, the interim or running account bills shall be submitted by the contractor for the work executed on the basis of such recorded measurements in the format of the Department in triplicate on or before the date of every month fixed for the same by the Engineer-in-Charge. CLAUSE 8

Completion Certificate and Completion Plans

Within ten days of the completion of the work, the contractor shall give notice of such completion to the Engineer-in-Charge and within thirty days of the receipt of such notice, the Engineer-in-Charge shall inspect the work and if there is no defect in the work, shall furnish the contractor with a final certificate of completion, otherwise a provisional certificate of physical completion indicating defects (a) to be rectified by the contractor and/or (b) for which payment will be made at reduced rates, shall be issued. But no final certificate of completion shall be issued, nor shall the work be considered to be complete for 'Civil Construction Works' until the contractor shall have removed from the premises on which the work shall be executed all scaffolding, surplus materials, rubbish and all huts and sanitary arrangements required for his/their work people on the site in connection with the execution of the works as shall have been erected or constructed by the contractor(s) and cleaned off the dirt from all wood work, doors, windows, walls, floor or other parts of the building, in, upon, or about which the work is to be executed or of which he may have had possession for the purpose of the execution; thereof, and not until the work shall have been measured by the Engineer-in-charge. If the contractor shall fail to comply with the requirements of this Clause as to removal of scaffolding, surplus materials and rubbish and all huts and sanitary arrangement as aforesaid and cleaning off dirt on or before the date fixed for the completion of work, the Engineer-incharge may at the expense of the contractor remove such scaffolding, surplus materials and rubbish etc., and dispose of the same as he thinks fit and clean off such dirt as aforesaid, and the contractor shall have no claim in respect of scaffolding or surplus materials as aforesaid except for any sum actually realized by the sale there of.

- a. For electrical and mechanical capital works: The contractor shall remove the rubbish from the site. Following conditions must be met before recording completion certificate:
 - Submits completion plan, maintenance manual, manufactures catalogue and gives performance test for system.
- b. For repair works: The performance of the repaired system has been tested and found satisfactory.
- c. For AMC work: The system has been tested for its performance/completeness and taken over by AAI/next agency for operation and maintenance.



CLAUSE 8A

Contractor to keep site clean

When the annual repairs and maintenance of works are carried out, the splashes and droppings from white washing colour washing, painting etc., on walls, floor, windows etc. shall be removed and the surface cleaned simultaneously with the completion of these items of work in the individual rooms, quarters or premises etc.

Where the work is done without waiting for the actual completion of all the other items of work in the contract, in case the contractor fails to comply with the requirements of this clause, the Engineer-in-charge shall have the right to get this work done at the cost of the contractor either departmentally or throughany other agency. Before taking such action, the Engineer-in-charge shall give ten days notice in writing to the contractor.

CLAUSE 8B

Completion Plans to be Submitted by the Contractor

The contractor shall submit completion plan as required vide General Specifications for Electrical works (Part-I internal) 2013 and (Part -II External) 1994 or latest available specifications, as applicable within thirty days of the completion of the work.

The contractor shall submit completion plan for building works, all services, and obtain occupancy certificate from local bodies on the basis of completion drawings within a period of 30 days from the date of completion.

The contractor shall also submit catalogues of all equipment's and maintenance manual for the complete BHS along with CT EDS systems . If contractor fails to submit completion plans of all works, he shall be liable to pay compensation @ 0.5% of the tendered value of works costing up to Rs.5 Crores subject to maximum of Rs.1.00 Lac and 0.25% for works costing more than Rs5 crores subject to maximum of Rs.1.5.Lac.ThedecisionofProject-in-charge in this regard shall be final and binding on the contractor.

8. Clause 9 Payment of final bill

The corrected final bill shall be submitted by the contractor in the same manner as specified in interim bills within three months of physical completion of the work or within one month of the date of the final certificate of completion furnished by the Engineer-in charge whichever is earlier. No further claims shall be made by the contractor after submission of the final bill and these shall be deemed to have been waived and extinguished. Payments of those items of the bill in respect of which there is no dispute and for those items which are in dispute on account of quantity and/ or rates shall be paid at approved quantity and/ or rates by the Engineer-in-charge, within three months period reckoned from the date of receipt of the bill by the Engineer in-Charge or his authorized representative, complete with account of materials issued by the Department and dismantled materials.

If the final bill is submitted by the contractor within the period specified above and payment of final bills is made by the AAI within above prescribed time limit, if delay in payment, a simple interest @ prevailing rate of interest of General Provident Fund shall be paid to the contractor from the date of expiry of prescribed time limit, provided the final bill submitted by the contractor is found to be in order.

The Final bill shall be prepared for both L1 & L2 bidders for all tendered items (excluding Extra Items based on market rate) and payment shall be made on the basis of lower of the two.

Payments due to the contractor and refund of various nature may, if so desired by him and wherever possible in banks be made through electronic payment mechanism instead of direct to him, provided that the contractor furnishes to the Engineer-in-Charge.

- i. Informations as per preform attached.
- ii. An authorization in the form of a legally valid document such as power of attorney conferring authority on the bank to receive payments and
- iii. His own acceptance of the correctness of the amount made out as being due to him by Authority or his signature on the bill or other claim preferred against Authority before settlement by the Engineer-in-charge of the account or claim by payment to the bank. While the receipt given by such banks shall constitute a full and sufficient discharge for the payment, the contractor shall whenever possible present his bills duly receipted and discharged through his bank. Nothing herein contained shall operate to create in favour of the bank any rights or equities vis-à-vis the Airports Authority of India.

CLAUSE 10

Mate rialssuppli ed by-Auth ority

Materials which Authority will supply are shown in Schedule 'B' which also stipulates quantum, place of issue and rate(s) to be charged in respect thereof. The contractor shall be bound to procure them from the Engineer in charge.

As soon as the work is awarded, the contractor shall finalise the programme for the completion of work as per clause 5 of this contract and shall give his estimates of materials required on the basis of drawings/ or schedule of quantities of the work. The contractor shall give in writing his requirement to the Engineer in charge, which shall be issued to him keeping in view the progress of work as assessed by the Engineer in Charge in accordance with the agreed phased programme of work indicating monthly requirements of various materials. The contractor shall place his indent in writing for issue of such materials at least 7 days in advance of hisrequirement.

Such materials shall be supplied for the purpose of the contract only and the value of the materials so supplied at the rates specified in the aforesaid schedule shall be set off or deducted, as and when materials are consumed in items of work (including normal wastage) for which payment is being made to the contractor, form any sum then due or which may therefore become due to the contractor under the contract or otherwise or from the security deposit. At the time of submission of bills, the contractor shall certify that balance of materials supplied is available at site in original good condition. The contractor shall submit along with every running bill (on account or interim bill) material wise reconciliation statements supported by complete calculations



reconciling total issue, total consumption and certified balance (diameter/ section-wise in the case of steel) and resulting variations and reasons thereof. Engineer in charge shall (whose decision shall be final and binding on the contractor) be within his rights to follow the procedure of recovery in clause 42 at any stage of the work if reconciliation is not found to be satisfactory.

The contractor shall bear the cost of getting the material issued, loading, transporting to site, unloading, storing under cover as required, cutting assembling and joining the several parts together as necessary. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any other clause of the contract and all stores / materials so supplied to the contractor or procured with the assistance of the AAI shall remain the absolute property of Authority and the contractor shall be the trustee of the stores/ materials, and the said stores/ materials shall not be removed/ disposed off from the site of the work on any account and shall be at all times open to inspection by the Engineer in charge or his authorised agent. Any such stores/ materials remaining unused shall be returned to the Engineer in charge in as good a condition in which they were originally supplied at a place directed by him, at a place of issue or any other place specified by him as he shall require, but in case it is decided not to take back the stores/ materials the contractor shall have no claim for compensation on any account of such stores/ materials so supplied to him as aforesaid and not used by him or for any wastage in or damage to in such stores/materials.

On being required to return the stores/ materials, the contractor shall hand over the stores/ materials on being paid or credited such price as the Engineer in charge shall determine, having due regard to the condition of the stores/ materials. The price allowed for credit to the contractor, however, shall be at the prevailing market rate not exceeding the amount charged to him, excluding the storage charge, if any. The decision of the Engineer-in-charge shall be final and conclusive. In the event of breach of the aforesaid condition, the contractor shall in addition to throwing himself open to account for contravention of the terms of the licenses or permit and/ or for criminal breach of trust, be liable to Authority for all advantages or profits resulting or which in the usual course would have resulted to him by reason of such breach. Provided that the contractor shall in no case be entitled to any compensation or damages on account of any delay in supply or non supply thereof all or any such materials and stores provided further that the contractor shall be bound to execute the entire work if the materials are supplied by the Authority within the original scheduled time for completion of the work plus 50% thereof or schedule time plus 6 months whichever is more if the time of completion of work exceeds 12 months, but if a part of the materials only has been supplied within the aforesaid period, then the contractor shall be bound to do so much of the work as may be possible with the materials and stores supplied in the aforesaid period. For the completion of the rest of the work, the contractor shall be entitled to such extension of time as may be determined by the Engineer in charge whose decision in this regard shall be final and binding on the

The contractor shall see that only the required quantities of materials are got issued. Any such material remaining unused and in perfectly good/ original condition at the time of completion or determination of the contract shall be returned to the Engineer-in-charge at the stores from which it was issued or at a place directed by him by a notice in writing. The contractor shall not be entitled for loading transporting, unloading and stacking of such unused material except

for the extra lead, if any involved, beyond the original place of issue.

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CLAUSE 10 A

Material s to be provided by the contract or

- 1. The contractor shall, at his own expense, provide all materials, required for the works other than those which are stipulated to be supplied bythe Authority.
- . The contractor shall, at his own expense and without delay; supply to the Engineer incharge samples of materials to be used on the work andshall get these approved in advance. All such materials to be provided by the contractor shall be in conformity with the specifications laid downor referred to in the contract. The contractor shall, if requested by the Engineer-in-charge furnish proof, to the satisfaction of the Engineer-in- charge that the materials so comply. The Engineer-in-charge shall within thirty days of supply of samples or within such further period as he may require intimate to the Contractor in writing whether samples are approved by him or not. If samples are not approved, the Contractor shall forthwith arrange to supply to the Engineer-in charge for his approval, fresh samples complying with the specifications laid down in the contract. When materials are required to be tested in accordance with specifications, approval of the Engineer-in-charge shall be issued after the test results are received.
- 3. The contractor shall at his risk and cost submit the samples of materials to be tested or analysed and shall not make use of or incorporate in the work any materials represented by the samples until the required tests or analysis have been made and materials finally accepted by the Engineer-incharge.
- 4. If any additional tests apart from mandatory tests specified in the contract are required to be carried out at the instance of AAI or any other advisory body, to ensure conformity of the item to the contract specifications, the cost of such tests shall be borne by AAI. In case the material / equipment fails in the above tests, the expenditure incurred by AAI on testing of such material or equipment along with incidental charges borne by AAI (if any) shall be recovered from thedues of the contractor and action shall be taken under Clause 16 and other relevant clauses of the contract.
- 5. The contractor shall not be eligible for any claim or compensation either arising out of any delay in the work or due to any corrective measures required to be taken on account of and as a result of testing of materials.
- 6. The contractor shall, at his risk and cost, make all arrangements and shall provide all facilities as the Engineer-in-charge may require for collecting and preparing the required number of samples for such tests at such time and to such place or places as may be directed by the Engineer-in-charge and bear all charges including testing charges. and cost of testing unless specifically provided for otherwise elsewhere in the contract or specifications. The Engineer-in- charge or his authorised representative shall always at all times have access to the works and to all workshops and places where work is being prepared or from where materials manufactured, articles or machinery are being obtained forthe works and the contractor shall afford every facility and every assistance in obtaining the right to such access.
- 7. The Engineer-in-charge shall have full powers to require the removal from the premises of all materials which in his opinion are not in accordance with the specifications and in case of default, the Engineer-in-charge shall be at liberty to employ at the expense of the contractor, other persons to remove the same without being answerableor accountable for any loss or damage that may happen or arise to such materials. The Engineer-in-charge shall also have full powers to require other proper materials to besubstituted thereof and in case of default, the Engineer-in-chargemay cause the same to be supplied and all costs which may be attracted for such removal and substitution shall be borne by the Contractor.
- 8. The contractor shall at his own expense, provide a material testing lab at the site for conducting routine field tests. The lab shall be equipped at least with the testing equipment as specified in Schedule F.
- 9. Details in respect of all mandatory tests shall be maintained in the desired format and attached with each Running Account Bill.



CLAUSE 10 B

(1)	Secured Advanc e on materia ls	1. The Contractor, on signing an indenture in the form to be specified in Appendix-XX, by the Engineer-in- charge, shall be entitled to be paid during the progressof the execution of the work upto 75% of the assessed value of any materials which are in the opinion of the Engineer-in-charge nonperishable, non fragile and noncombustible and are in accordance with the contract and which have been brought on the site in connection therewith and are adequately stored and/ or protected against damage by weather or other causes but which have not at time of advance been incorporated in the works. When materials on account of which an advance has been made under this sub-clause are incorporated in the work, the amount of such advance shall be recovered/ deducted from the next payment made under any of the clause or clauses of this contract. Such secured advance shall also be payable on other items of perishable nature, fragile and combustible with the approval of the Engineer-in-charge provided the contactor provides a comprehensive insurance cover for the full cost of such materials. The decision of the Engineer-in-charge shall be final and binding on the contractor in this matter. No secured advance, shall however, be paid on high-risk materials such as ordinary glass, sand, petrol, diesel etc. The secured advance shall also be payable against items brought atsite for use in electrical and mechanical systems. Such secured advance shall be paid on submission of Collateral Bank Guarantee submitted by the vendor against the payment in case equipment/system fails to perform on testing and commissioning. Normally secured advance is paid up to 75% of the assessed value of items but in any case it shall not exceed 80% of cost of items indicated for supply of equipment.
(II)	Mobil izatio n Adva nce	2. Mobilization advances not exceeding 10% of contract amount may be given, if requested by the contractor in writing within 6 month of the order to commence the work. Such advance shall be release in two or more installments to be determined by the Engineer-in-charge. The amount of any installment shall not exceed 5% of the contract amount of the work. The first installment of such advance shall be released by Engineer-in-charge to the contractor on a request made by the contractor to the Engineer-in-charge in this behalf. The second and subsequent installments shall be released by Engineer-in-charge only after the contractor furnishes a proof of the satisfactory utilization of the earlier installment (s) to the satisfaction of the Engineer-in-charge. Before any installment of advance is release, the contractor shall executive Bank Guarantee Bonds not more than 6 (six) in number from commercial bank for the amount equal to 110% of the amount of advance and valid for period till recovery of advance. This (Bank Guarantee from commercial bank on prescribed format for the amount equal to 110% of the balance amount of advance) shall be kept renewed from time to time to cover the balance amount and likely period of complete recovery.



Intere st on Mobil izatio n advan ce	3. The mobilization advance bear simple interest at the rate as mentioned in Schedule-F per annum and shall be calculated from the date of payment to the date of recovery, both days inclusive, on the outstanding amount of advance.
Recov ery of Mobil izatio n advan ce	4. Recovery of such sums advanced shall be made by the deduction from the contractor's bills commencing after first ten percent of the gross value of the work is executed and paid, on pro-rata percentage basis to the gross value of the work billed beyond 10% in such a way that the entire advance is recovered by the time eighty percent of the gross value of the contract is executed and paid, together with interest due on the entire outstanding amount up to the date of recovery of the installment.
	If the circumstances are considered reasonable by the Engineer-in-charge, the period mentioned for request by the contractor in writing for grant of mobilization advance may be extended at the discretion of the Engineer-in-charge.

CLAUSE 10 C

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If after submission of the tender, the price of any material incorporated in the works and /or wages of Labor increases as a direct result of the coming into force of any fresh law or statutory rule or order (but not due to any variation of rates in GST applicable on such material(s) being considered under this clause) beyond the prices / wages prevailing at the time of last stipulated date for receipt of tenders including extensions, if any, for the work, during contract period including the justified period extended under the provisions of the Clause 5 of the Contract without any action under Clause 2, then the amount of the contract shall accordingly be varied.

If after submission of the tender, the price of any material incorporated in the works and / or wages of Labor as prevailing at the time of last stipulated date of receipt of tender including extensions, if any, is decreased as a direct result of the coming into force of any fresh law or statutory rule or order (but not due to any variation of rate in GST applicable on such material(s) being considered under this clause), Authority shall in respect of materials incorporated in the works and/ or Labor engaged on the execution of the work after the date of coming into force of such law, statutory rule or order be entitled to deduct from the dues of the contractor, such amount as shall be equivalent to the difference between the prices of the materials and/ or wages as prevailed at the time of the last stipulated date for receipt of tenders including extensions if any, for the work and the prices of materials and/ or wages of Labor on the coming into force of such law, statutory rule or order. This will be applicable for the contract period including the justified period extended under the provisions of clause 5 of the contract without any action under clause2.

Engineer-in-charge shall call books of account and other relevant documents from the contractor to satisfy himself about reasonability of increase in prices of materials and wages. The contractor shall, within a reasonable time of his becoming aware of any alteration in the price of any such materials and/ or wages of Labor, give notice thereof to the Engineer-in-charge stating that the same is given pursuant to this condition together with all information relating thereto which he may be in position to supply.

For this purpose, the Labor component of 85% of the value of the work executed during period under consideration shall not exceed the percentage as specified in Schedule F, and the increase / decrease in Labor shall be considered on the minimum daily wages in rupees of any unskilled mazdoor,

fixed under any law, statutory rule or order.

Cost of Design & Detailing shall be treated as civil work for EPC contract Components for materials, Labor, etc. shall be pre-determined for every work and incorporated in the conditions of contract attached to the tender document included in Schedule F. The decision of the Engineer-incharge in working out such percentage shall be binding on the contractors.

- iii) The following principle shall be followed while working out the payment/ recovery on account of variation of prices of materials and/ or wages of Labor.
 - a) The compensation for escalation shall be worked out at quarterly intervals and shall be with respect to the cost of work done as per bills paid during the three calendar months of the said quarter. The date of submission of bill finally by the contractor to the department shall be the guiding factor to decide the bills relevant to the quarterly interval. The first such payment shall be made at the end of three months after the month (excluding the month in which the work order issued) and thereafter at three months interval. At the time of completion of the work, the last period for payment might become less than 3 months, depending on the actual date of completion.
 - (b) The indices as defined below (excluding LI) relevant to any quarter/period for which such compensation is to be paid shall be the arithmetical average of the indices relevant to the three calendar months. If the period up to the date of completion after the quarter covered by the last such installment of payment, is less than three months, the indices shall be the average of the indices for the months falling within that period.
 - (c) The minimum wage of an unskilled Mazdoor shall be the higher of the wage notified by Government of India, Ministry of Labor and that notified by the local administration both relevant to the place of work and the period of reckoning.
 - (d) The escalation for Labor also shall be paid at the same quarterly intervals when escalation due to increase in cost of materials is paid under this clause. If such revision of minimum wages takes place during any such quarterly intervals, the escalation compensation shall be payable at revised rates only for work done in subsequent quarters;

The contractor shall also conform exactly, fully and faithfully to the design, drawings and instructions in writing in respect to the work signed by the Engineer in charge and the contractor shall be furnished free of charge one copy of the contract documents together with specifications, designs, drawings and instructions as are not included in the standard specifications of Central Public Works Department specified in Schedule F or in any Bureau of Indian Standard or any other published standard or code or Schedule of Rates or any other printed publication referred to elsewhere in the contract. The contractor shall comply with the provisions of the contract and with the care and diligence execute and maintain the works and provide all Labor and materials, tools and plants including for measurements and supervision of all works, structural plans and other things of temporary or permanent nature required for such execution and maintenance in so far as the necessity for providing these, is specified or is reasonably inferred from the contract. The contractor shall take full responsibility for adequacy suitability and safety of all the works and methods ofconstruction.

Foreclosure of contract due to Abandonment or Reduction in Scope of Work If at any time after acceptance of the tender or during the progress of work the purpose or object for which the work is being done changes due to any supervening cause and as a result of which the work has to be abandoned or reduced in scope the Engineer-in-Charge shall give notice in writing to that effect to the contractor and the contractor stating the decision as well as the cause for such decision and the contractor shall act accordingly in the matter. The contractor shall have no claim to any payment of compensation or otherwise whatsoever, on account of any profit or advantage which he might have derived from the execution of the works in full but which he did not derive in consequence of the foreclosure of the whole or part of the works. The contractor shall be paid at contract rates, full amount for works executed at site and, in addition, a reasonable amount as certified by the Engineer-in-Charge for the items hereunder mentioned which could not be utilized on the work to the full extent in view of the fore closure;

- i. Any expenditure incurred on preliminary site work, e.g. temporary access roads, temporary Labor huts, staff quarters and site office; storage accommodation and water storage tanks.
- ii. AAI shall have the option to take over contractor's materials or any part thereof either brought to site or of which the contractor is legally bound to accept delivery from suppliers (for incorporation in or incidental to the work) provided, however AAI shall be bound to take over the materials or such portions thereof as the contractor does not desire to retain. For materials taken over or to be taken over by AAI, cost of such materials as detailed by Engineer-in- Charge shall be paid. The cost shall, however, take into account purchase price, cost of transportation and deterioration or damage which may have been caused to materials whilst in the custody of the contractor.
- iii. If any materials supplied by AAI are rendered surplus, the same except normal wastage shall be returned by the contractor to AAI at rates not exceeding those at which these were originally issued, less allowance for any deterioration or damage which may have been caused whilst the materials were in the custody of the contractor. In addition, cost of transporting such materials from site to AAI stores, if so required by AAI, shall be paid.



- iv. Reasonable compensation for transfer of T & P from site to contractor's permanent stores or to his other works, whichever is less. If T & P are not transported to either of the said places, no cost of transportation shall be payable.
- v. Reasonable compensation for repatriation of contractor's site staff and imported Labor to the extent necessary.

The contractor shall, if required by the Engineer- in-Charge, furnish to him, books of account, wage books, time sheets and other relevant documents and evidence as may be necessary to enable him to certify the reasonable amount payable under this condition.

The reasonable amount of items on (i), (iv) and (v) above shall not be in excess of 2% of the cost of the work remaining incomplete on the date of closure, i.e. total stipulated cost of the work as per accepted tender less the cost of work actually executed under the contract and less the cost of contractor's materials at site taken over by the AAI as per item (ii) above. Provided always that against any payments due to the contractor on this account or otherwise, the Engineer- in-Charge shall be entitled to recover or be credited with any outstanding balances due from the contractor for advance paid in respect of any tool, plants and materials and any other sums which at the date of termination were recoverable by the AAI from the contractor under the terms of the contract.

In the event of action being taken under clause 13 to reduce the scope of work, the contractor may furnish fresh Performance Guarantee on the same conditions, in the same manner and at the same rate for the balance tendered amount and initially valid up to the extended date the completion or stipulated date of completion if no extension has been granted plus 180 days beyond that. Wherever, such a fresh Performance Guarantee is furnished by the contractor, the Engineer in Charge may return the previous Performance Guarantee.

CLAUSE 14

Carrying out part Work at risk & cost of contractor

a. If contractor:

- i. At any time makes default during currency of work or does not execute any part of the work with due diligence and continues to do so even after a notice in writing of 7 days in this respect from the Engineer –in –Charge ; or
- ii. Commits default in complying with any of the terms and conditions of the contract and does not remedy it or takes effective steps to remedy it within 7 days even after a notice in writing is given in that behalf by the Engineer-in-Charge; or
- iii. Fails to complete the work(s) or items of work with individual dates of completion, on or before the date(s) so determined, and does not complete them within the period specified in the notice given in writing in that behalf by the Engineer-in-Charge.
- b. The Engineer- in-Charge without invoking action under clause 3 may, without prejudice to any other right or remedy against the contractor which have either accrued or accrue thereafter to AAI, by a notice in writing to take the part work / part incomplete work of any item(s) out of his hands and shall have powers to:
 - i. Take possession of the site and any materials, constructional plant, implements, stores, etc., there on; and/or
 - ii. Carry out the part work / part incomplete work of any item(s) by any means at the risk and cost of the contractor.



- c. The Engineer-in-Charge shall determine the amount, if any, is recoverable from the contractor for completion of the part work/ part incomplete work of any item(s) taken out of his hands and executed at the risk and cost of the contractor, the liability of contractor on account of loss or damage suffered by AAI because of action under this clause shall not exceed 10% of the tendered value of the work.
- d. In determining the amount, credit shall be given to the contractor with the value of work done in all respect in the same manner and at the same rate as if it had been carried out by the original contractor under the terms of his contract, the value of contractor's materials taken over and incorporated in the work and use of plant and machinery belonging to the contractor. The certificate of the Engineer-in-Charge as to the value of work done shall be final and conclusive against the contractor provided always that action under this clause shall only be taken after giving notice in writing to the contractor. Provided also that if the expenses incurred by the department are less than the amount payable to the contractor at his agreement rates, the difference shall not be payable to the contractor.
- e. Any excess expenditure incurred or to be incurred by AAI in completing the part work/ part incomplete work of any item(s) or the excess loss of damages suffered or may be suffered by AAI as aforesaid after allowing such credit shall without prejudice to any other right or remedy available to AAI in law or per as agreement be recovered from any money due to the contractor on any account, and if such money is insufficient, the contractor shall be called upon in writing and shall be liable to pay the same within 30days.
- f. If the contractor fails to pay the required sum within the aforesaid period of 30 days, the Engineer-in-Charge shall have the right to sell any or all of the contractors' unused materials, constructional plant, implements, temporary building at site etc. and adjust the proceeds of sale thereof towards the dues recoverable from the contractor under the contract and if thereafter there remains any balance outstanding, it shall be recovered in accordance with the provisions of the contract/provisions of law.

In the event of above course being adopted by the Engineer-in-Charge, the contractor shall have no claim to compensation for any loss sustained by him by reason of his having purchased or procured any materials or entered into any engagements or made any advance on any account or with a view to the execution of the work or the performance of the contract.

CLAUSE 15

Suspension of Work

- i. The contractor shall, on receipt of the order in writing of the Engineer-in-Charge, (whose decision shall be final and binding on the contractor) suspend the progress of the works or any part thereof for such time and in such manner as the Engineer-in- Charge may consider necessary so as not to cause any damage or injury to the work already done or endanger the safety thereof for any of the following reasons:
 - a. on account of any default on the part of the contractor or;
 - b. for proper execution of the works or part thereof for reasons other than the default of the contractor; or
 - c. For safety of the works or part there of.

The contractor shall, during such suspension, properly protect and secure the works to the extent necessary and carry out the instructions given in that behalf by the Engineer-in-Charge.



- ii. If the suspension is ordered for reasons (b) and (c) in sub-para (i) above (but not attributed to contractor):
 - a. the contractor shall be entitled to an extension of time equal to the period of every such suspension PLUS 25% for completion of the item or group of items of work for which a separate period of completion is specified in the contract and of which the suspended work forms a part, and;
 - b. If the total period of all such suspensions in respect of an item or group of items or work for which a separate period of completion is specified in the contract exceeds thirty days, the contractor shall, in addition, be entitled to such compensation as the Engineer-in-Charge may consider reasonable in respect of salaries and/or wages paid by the contractor to his employees and Labor at site, remaining idle during the period of suspension, adding thereto 2% to cover indirect expenses of the contractor provided the contractor submits his claim supported by details to the Engineer-in-Charge within fifteen days of the expiry of the period of 30days.
 - c. If the works or part thereof is suspended on the orders of the Engineer-in-Charge for more than three months at a time, except when suspension is ordered for reasons (a) in sub-para (i) above, the contractor may after receipt of such order serve a written notice on the Engineer-in-Charge requiring permission within fifteen days from receipt by the Engineer-incharge of the said notice, to proceed with the work or part thereof in regard to which progress has been suspended and if such permission is not granted within that time, the contractor, if he intends to treat the suspension, where it affects only a part of the works as on omission of such part by AAI or where it affects whole of the works, as an abandonment of the works by AAI, shall within ten days of expiry of such period of 15 days give notice in writing of his intention to the Engineerin-Charge. In the event of the contractor treating the suspension as an abandonment of the contract by AAI, he shall have no claim to payment of any compensations on account of any profit or advantage which he might have derived from the execution of the work in full but which he could not derive in consequence of the abandonment. He shall, however, be entitled to such compensation, as the Engineer-in-Charge may consider reasonable, in respect of salaries and/or wages paid by him to his employees and Labor at site, remaining idle in consequence adding to the total thereof 2% to cover indirect expenses of the contractor provided the contractor submits his claim supported by details to the Engineer-in-Charge within 30 days of the expiry of the period of 3 months.

Action in case Work not done as per Specifications All works under or in course of execution or executed in pursuance of the contract, shall at all times be open and accessible to the inspection and supervision of the Engineer-in-Charge, his authorize subordinates in charge of the work and all the superior officers, officer of the Quality Assurance Unit of the AAI or any organization engaged by the Department of Quality Assurance and of the Chief technical Examiner's Office, and the contractor shall, at all times, during the usual working hours and at all other times at which reasonable notice of the visit of such officers has been given to the contractor, either himself be present to receive orders and instructions or have a responsible agent duly accredited in writing, present for that purpose. Orders given to the Contractor's agent shall be considered to have the same force as if they had been given to the contractor himself.

If it shall appear to the Engineer-in -charge or his authorized subordinates in charge of the work or to the Executive Director-In-charge of quality assurance or his subordinate officers or the officers of the organization engaged by the AAI for quality Assurance or to the Chief Technical Examiner or his subordinate officers, that any work has been executed with unsound, imperfect, or unskillful workmanship, or with materials or articles provided by him for the execution of the work which are unsound or of a quality inferior to that contracted or otherwise not in accordance with the contract, the contractor shall, on demand in writing which shall be made within twelve months (six months in the case of work costing Rs.10 lac and below except road work) of the completion of the work from the Engineer-in-Charge specifying the work, materials or articles complained of notwithstanding that the same may have been passed, certified and paid for forthwith rectify, or remove and reconstruct the work so specified in whole or in part, as the case may require or as the case may be, remove the materials or articles so specified and provide other proper and suitable materials or articles at his own charge and cost. In the event of the failing to do so within a period specified by the Engineer-in-Charge in his demand aforesaid, then the contractor shall be liable to pay compensation at the same rate as under clause 2 of the contract (for non-completion of the work in time) for this default.

In such case the Engineer-in-Charge may not accept the item of work at the rates applicable under the contract but may accept such items at reduced rates as the authority specified in schedule 'F' may considered reasonable during the preparation of on account bills or final bill if the item is so acceptable without detriment to the safety and utility of the item and the structure or he may reject the work outright without any payment and/or get it and other connected and incidental items rectified, or removed and re-executed at the risk and cost of the contractor. Decision of the Engineer-in-Charge to be conveyed in writingin respect of the same will be final and binding on the contractor.

Contractor Liable for Damages, defects during maintenance period If the contractor or his working people or servants shall break, deface, injure or destroy any part of building in which they may be working, or any building, road, road kerb fence, enclosure, water pipe, cables, drains, electric or telephone post or wires, trees, grass or grassland, or cultivated ground contiguous to the premises on which the work or any part is being executed, or if any damage shall happen to the work while in progress, from any cause whatever or if any defect, shrinkage or other faults appear in the work within **Twelve months** (six months in the case of work costing Rs. Ten lacs and below except road work) after a certificate final or otherwise of its completion shall have been given by the Engineer-



in-charge as aforesaid arising out of defect or improper materials or workmanship the contractor shall upon receipt of a notice in writing on that behalf make the same good at his own expense or in default the Engineer in- charge cause the same to be made good by other workmen and deduct the expense from any sums that may be due or at any time thereafter may become due to the contractor, or from his security deposit or the proceeds of sale thereof or of a sufficient portion thereof. The security deposit of the contractor shall not be refunded before the expiry of twelve Six months (six months in the case of work costing Rs. Ten lacs and below except road work) after the issue of the certificate final or otherwise, of completion of work, or till the final bill has been prepared and passed whichever is later. Provided that in the case of road work, if in the opinion of the Engineerin-charge, half of the security deposit is sufficient, to meet all liabilities of the contractor under this contract, half of the security deposit will be refundable after six months and the remaining half after twelve months of the issue of the said certificate of completion or till the final bill has been prepared and passed whichever is later.

CLAUSE 18

Contractor to Supply Tools & Plants etc.

The contractor shall provide at his own cost all materials (except such special materials, if any, as may in accordance with the contract be supplied from the Engineer-in charge's stores) machinery, tools & plants as specified in Schedule F. in addition to this, appliances, implements, other plants, ladders, cordage, tackle, scaffolding and temporary works required for the proper execution of the work, whether original, altered or substituted and whether included in the specifications or other documents forming part of the contract or referred to in these conditions or not, or which may be necessary for the purpose of satisfying or complying with the requirements of the Engineer-in charge as to any matter as to which under these conditions he is entitled to be satisfied, or which he is entitled to require together with carriage therefor to and from the work. The contractor shall also supply without charge the requisite number of persons with the means and materials, necessary for the purpose of setting out works, and counting, weighing and assisting the measurement for examination at any time and from time to time of the work or materials. Failing his so doing, the same may be provided by the Engineer-in-charge at the expense of the contractor and the expenses may be deducted, from any money due to the contractor, under this contract or otherwise and/ or from his security deposit or the proceeds of sale thereof, or of a sufficient portions thereof.

CLAUSE 18 A

In every case in which by virtue of the provisions of the Contract Labor (Regulation and Abolition) act 1970, and the Contract Labor (Regulation and Abolition) Central Rules, 1971, AAI is obliged to pay any amounts of wages to a workman employed by the contractor in execution of the works, or to incur any expenditure in providing welfare and health amenities required to be provided under the above said Act and the rules under Clause 19H or under the AAI Contractor's Labor Regulations or under the Rules framed by AAI from time to time for the protection of health and sanitary arrangements for workers employed by AAI Contractors, AAI will recover from the contractor the amount of wages so paid or the amount of expenditure so incurred and without prejudice to the rights of the AAI under sub section (2) of Section 20, sub section (4) of Section 21, of the Contract Labor (Regulation and Abolition) Act, 1970, AAI shall be at liberty to recover such amount or any part thereof by deducting it from the security deposit or from any sum due by AAI to the contractor whether under this contract or otherwise AAI shall not be bound to contest any claim made against it under sub section (1) of Section 20, sub section (4) of Section 21, of the said Act, except on the written request of the contractor and upon his giving to the AAI full security for all costs for which AAI might become liable in contesting such claim.

Any failure to fulfill these requirements shall attract the penal provisions of this contract arising out of the resultant non execution of the work.

- iv. The following deductions shall be permissible to be made by the Engineer-in-Charge.
 - a. The Engineer-in-charge concerned shall have the right to deduct from the moneys due to the contractor or any sum required or estimated to be required for making good the loss suffered by a worker or workers by reason of non-fulfillment of the conditions of the contract for the benefit of the workers, non-payment of wages or of deductions made from his or their wages which are not justified by their terms of the contract or nonobservance of the Regulations.
 - b. Under the provision of Minimum Wages (Central) Rule 1950 the contractor is bound to allow to the Labors directly or indirectly employed in the works one day rest for 6 days continuous work and pay wages at the same rate as for duty. In the event of default, the Engineer-in-charge shall have the right to deduct the sum or sums not paid on account of wages for weekly holidays to any Labors and pay the same to the persons entitled thereto from any money due to the contractor by the Engineer-in-charge concerned.

In the case of Union Territory of Delhi, however, as the all-inclusive minimum daily wages fixed under Notification of the Delhi Administration No.F.12(162)MWO/DAB/43884-91, dated 31.12.1979 as amended from time to time are inclusive of wages for the weekly day of rest, the question of extra payment for weekly holiday would not arise.

- v. The contractor shall comply with the provisions of the Payment of wages Act, 1936, Minimum Wages Act, 1948, Employees Liability Act, 1938, Workmen's Compensation Act, 1923, Industrial Disputes Act, 1947, Maternity Benefits Act, 1961, and the Contractor's Labor (Regulation and Abolition) Act 1970, or the modifications thereof or any other laws relating thereto and the rule made thereunder from time to time.
- vi. The contractor shall indemnify and keep indemnified Authority against payments to be made under and for the observance of the laws aforesaid and the AAI Contractor's Labor Regulations without prejudice to his right to claim indemnity from his sub-contractors.

Whatever is the minimum wage for the time being, or if the wage payable is higher than such wage, such wage shall be paid by the contractor to the workmen directly without the intervention of Jamadar and that Jamadar shall not be entitled to deduct or recover any amount from the minimum wage payable to the workmen as and by way of commissioner otherwise.

Dispute Resolution Mechanism and Arbitration Except where otherwise provided in the contract, all questions and disputes relating to the meaning of the specifications, design, drawings and instruction here-in before mentioned and as to the quality of workmanship or materials used on the work or as to any other question, claim, right, matter or thing whatsoever, in any way arising out of or relating to the contract, designs, drawings, specifications, estimates, instructions, orders or these conditions or otherwise concerning the work or the execution or failure to execute the same whether arising during the progress of the work or after the cancellation, termination, completion or abandonment thereof shall be dealt with as mentioned hereinafter:

i. If the contractor considers any work demanded of him to be outside the requirement of the contract, or disputes any drawing, record or decision given in writing by the Engineer-in-Charge or if the Engineer in Charge considers any act or decision of the contractor on any matter in connection with or arising out of the contract or carrying out of the work, to be unacceptable and is disputed such party shall promptly within 15 days of the arising of the disputes request the Executive Director (Eng.)/Regional Executive Director/Member (Plg) /Chairman, AAI as the case may be, who shall refer the dispute to Dispute Redressal Committee (DRC) within 15 days along with a list of disputes with amounts claimed if any, in respect of each such disputes. The Dispute Redressal Committee (DRC) shall give the opposing party two weeks for written response, and give its decision within a period of 60 days extendable by 30 days by consent of both the parties from the receipt of from the Executive Director (Eng.)/Regional Executive reference Director/Member (Plg) /Chairman, AAI. Provided that no party shall be represented before the Dispute Redressal Committee by an advocate / legal counsel etc.

If the Dispute Redressal Committee (DRC) fails to give its decision within aforesaid period or any party is dis-satisfied with the decision of Dispute Redressal Committee (DRC) or expiry of time limit given above, then either party may within a period of 30 days from the receipt of the decision of Dispute Redressal Committee (DRC), give notice to the Executive Director (Eng.)/Regional Executive Director/Member (Plg)/Chairman, AAI as the case may be for appointment of Arbitrator on prescribed proforma as per Appendix-XVII. under intimation to the other party.

It is also a term of contract and each party invoking Arbitration must exhaust the aforesaid mechanism of settlement of claims/disputes prior to invoking Arbitration.

The Executive Director (Eng.)/Regional Executive Director/Member (Plg) /Chairman, AAI shall in such case appoint the sole arbitrator or one of the three arbitrators as the case may be within 30 days of receipt of such a request and refer such disputes to arbitration. Wherever the Arbitral Tribunal consists of three Arbitrators, the contractor shall appoint one arbitrator within 30 days of making request for arbitration or of receipt of request by Engineer in Charge to Executive Director (Eng.)/Regional Executive Director/Member (Plg) /Chairman, AAI for appointment of arbitrator, as the case may be, and two appointed arbitrators shall appoint the third arbitrator, who shall act as the presiding arbitrator. In the event of:

- a. A party fails to appoint the second arbitrator, or
- b. The two appointed arbitrators fail to appoint the Presiding Arbitrator, then Member (Plg)/Chairman, AAI shall appoint the second or Presiding Arbitrator as the case may be.



ii Disputes or difference shall be referred for adjudication through arbitration by a Tribunal having Sole Arbitrator where tendered amount is Rs.300.00 Cr or less. Where tendered value is more than Rs.300.00 Cr., Tribunal shall consist of three arbitrators as above. The requirements of the arbitration and the conciliation act, 1996 (26 of 1996) and further modified Act in 2015 and any further statutory modifications or reenactment thereof and the rules made thereunder and for the time being in force shall be applicable.

It is a term of this contract that the party invoking Arbitration shall give a list of disputes with amounts, claimed, if any, in respect of each such disputes along with the notice for appointment of Arbitrator and giving reference to the decision of the DRC.

It is also term of this contract that any member of Arbitration Tribunal shall be a graduate engineer with experience in handling public works, engineering contracts at a level not lower than Chief Engineer. This shall be treated as mandatory qualification to be appointed as Arbitrator.

Parties, before or at the time of appointment of Aarbitral Tribunal may agree in writing for fast track arbitration as per the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 (26 of 1996) as amended in 2015.

Subject to provision in the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 (26 of 1996) as amended in 2015 whereby the counter claims if any can be directly filed before the arbitrator without any requirement of reference by the Appointing Authority, the Arbitrator shall adjudicate on only such disputes as are referred to him by the appointing authority and give separate award against each disputes and claim referred to him and in all cases where the total amount of the claims by any party exceed Rs.1,00,000/-, the Arbitrator shall give reasons for the award.

It is also a term of the contract that if any fees are payable to the arbitrator, these shall be paid as per the Act. It is also a term of the contract that the arbitrator shall be deemed to have entered on the reference on the date he issues notice to both the parties calling them to submit their statement of claims and counter statement of claims.

The place of the arbitration shall be mentioned in schedule 'F'. In case there is no mention of place of arbitration, the Arbitral Tribunal shall determine the place of arbitration. The venue of the arbitration shall be such place as may be fixed by the Arbitral Tribunal in consultation with both the parties. Failing any such agreement, then the Arbitral Tribunal shall decide the venue.

CLAUSE 26

Contractor to indemnify AAI against Patent Rights

The contractor shall fully indemnify and keep indemnified the Chairman AAI against any action, claim or proceeding relating to infringement or use of any patent or design or any alleged patent or design rights and shall pay and royalties which may be payable in respect of any article or part thereof included in the contract. In the event of any claims made under or action brought against AAI in respect of any such matters as aforesaid, the contractor shall be immediately notified thereof and the contractor shall be at liberty, at his own expense, to settle any dispute or to conduct any litigation that may arise there from, provided that the contractor shall not be liable to indemnify the AAI if the infringement of the patent or design or any alleged patent or design right is the direct result of an order passed by the Engineer-in-Charge in this behalf.

Lump sum Provisions in Tender

When the estimate on which a tender is made, includes lump sum in respect of parts of the work, the contractor shall be entitled to payment in respect of the items of work involved or the part of the work in question at the same rates as are payable under this contract for such items ,or if the part of work in question is not, in the opinion of the Engineer in Charge payable of measurement, the Engineer in Charge may at his discretion pay the lump—sum amount entered in the estimate, and the certificate in writing of the Engineer in Charge shall be final and conclusive against the contractor with regard to any sum or sums payable to him under the provision of the clause.

CLAUSE28

Action where no specifications are specified

In the case of any class of work for which there is no such specifications as referred to in Clause 11, such work shall be carried out in accordance with the Bureau of Indian Standards Specifications. In case there are no such specifications in Bureau of Indian Standards, the work shall be carried out as per manufacturer's specifications.

In case there are no such specifications as required above, the work shall be carried out in all respects in accordance with the instructions and requirements of the Engineer-in-Charge.

With-holding and lien in respect of sums due from contractor

i. Whenever any claims for payment of a sum of money arises out of or under the contract or against the contractor, the Engineer-in-Charge or the AAI shall be entitled to withhold and also have a lien to retain such sum or sums in whole or in part from the security, if any deposited by the contractor and for the purpose aforesaid, the Engineer-in-Charge or the AAI shall be entitled to withhold the security deposit if any, furnished as the case may be and also have a lien over the same pending finalization or adjudication of any such claim. In the event of the security being insufficient to cover the claimed amount or amounts or if no security has been taken from the contractor, the Engineer-in-Charge or the AAI shall be entitled to withhold and have lien to retain to the extent of such claimed amount or amounts referred to above from any sum or sums found payable or which may at any time thereafter become payable to the contractor under the same contract or any other contract with the Engineer-in Charge of the AAI or any contracting person through the Engineer-in-Charge pending finalization of adjudication of any such claim.

It is an agreed term of the contract that the sum of money or moneys so withheld or retained under the lien referred to above by the Engineer-in-Charge or AAI will be kept withheld or retained as such by the Engineer-in-Charge or AAI till the claim arising out of or under the contract is determined by the arbitrator. (if the contract is governed by the arbitration clause) or by the competent court, as the case may be and that the contractor will have no claim for interest or damages whatsoever on any account in respect of such withholding or retention under the lien referred to above and duly notified as such to the contractor. For the purpose of this clause, where the contractor is a partnership firm or a limited company, the Engineer-in-Charge or the AAI shall be entitled to withhold and also have a lien to retain towards such claimed amount or amounts in whole or in part from any sum found payable To any partner/limited company as the case may be, whether in his individual



capacity or otherwise.

AAI shall have the right to cause an audit and technical examination of the works and the final bills of the contractor including all supporting vouchers, abstract, etc,. to be made after payment of the final bill and if as a result of such audit and technical examination any sum is found to have been overpaid in respect of any work done by contractor under the contract or any work claimed to have been done by the him under the contract and found not to have been executed, the contractor shall be liable to refund the amount of over payment and it shall be lawful for AAI to recover the same from him in the manner prescribed in sub-clause (i) of this clause or in any other manner legally permissible; and if it is found that the contractor was paid less than what was due to him under the contract in respect of any work executed by him under it, the amount of such under payment shall be duly paid by AAI to the contractor, without any interest there on whats over.

Provided that the AAI shall not be entitled to recover any sum overpaid, nor the contractor shall be entitled to payment of any sum paid short where such payment has been agreed upon between the Executive Director Engineering / General Manager Engineering on the one hand and the contractor on the other under any term of the contract permitting payment for work after assessment by the Executive Director Engineering / General Manager Engineering.

CLAUSE 29 A

Lien in respect of claims in other Contracts

- i. Any sum of money due and payable to the contractor (including the security deposit refundable to him) under the contract may be withheld or retained by way of lien by the Engineer-in-Charge or the AAI or any other contracting person or persons through Engineer-in-Charge against any claim of the Engineer-in-Charge or AAI or such other person or persons in respect of payment of a sum of money arising out of or under any other contract made by the contractor with the Engineer-in-Charge or the AAI or with such other person or persons.
- ii. It is an agreed term of the contract that the sum of money so withheld or retained under this clause by the Engineer-in-Charge or the AAI will be kept withheld or retained as such by the Engineer-in-Charge or the AAI or till his claim arising out of the same contract or any other contract is either mutually settled or determined by the arbitration clause or by the competent court, as the case may be and that the contractor shall have no claim for interest or damages whatsoever on this account or on any other ground in respect of any sum of money withheld or retained under this clause and duly notified assuch to the contractor.

CLAUSE 30

Employment of coal mining or controlled area Labor not permissible

- i. The contractor shall not employ coal mining or controlled area Labor falling under any category whatsoever or in connection with the work or recruit labor from area within a radius of 32 km (20 miles) of the controlled area. Subject as above the contractor shall employ imported Labor only i.e., deposit imported Labor or Labor imported by contractors from area, from which import is permitted.
- ii. Where ceiling price for imported Labor has been fixed by State or Regional Labor Committees not more than that ceiling price shall be paid to the Labor by the contractor.
- iii. The contractor shall immediately remove any Laborer who may be pointed



out by the Engineer-in-Charge as being a coal mining or controlled area laborer. Failure to do so shall render the contractor liable to pay to AAI a sum calculated at the rate of Rs.10/- per day per laborer. The certificate of the Engineer-in —Charge about the number of coal mining or controlled area laborer and the number of days for which they worked shall be final and binding upon all parties to this contract.

iv. It is declared and agreed between the parties that the aforesaid stipulation in this clause is one in which the public are interested within the meaning of the exception in Section 74 of Indian Contract Act, 1872.

Explanation:-

Controlled area mean the following areas:

Districts of Dhanbad, Hazaribagh, Jamtara- Sub-Division under Santhal Pargana Commissionary, District of Bankuara, Birbhum, Burdwan, District of Bilaspur. Any other area which may be declared a Controlled Area by or with the approval of the Central Government.

CLAUSE 31

Unfiltered water supply

The contractor(s) shall make his/their own arrangements for water required for the work and nothing extra will be paid for the same. This will be subject to the following conditions.

- i. That the water used by the contractor (s) shall be fit for construction purposes to the satisfaction of the Engineer-in-Charge.
- ii. The Engineer-in-Charge shall make alternative arrangements for supply of water at the risk and cost of contractor (s) if the arrangements made by the contractor(s)forprocurementofwaterareintheopinionoftheEngineer-in-Charge, unsatisfactory.

CLAUSE 31A

Departmental water supply, if available

Water if available may be supplied to the contractor by the department subject to the following conditions:-

- i. The water charges @1% shall be recovered on gross amount of the work done
- ii. The contractor(s) shall make his/their own arrangement of water connection and laying of pipelines from existing main of source of supply.
- iii. The Department do not guarantee to maintain uninterrupted supply of water and it will be incumbent on the contractor (s) to make alternative arrangements for water at his/their own cost in the event of any temporary break down in the AAI's water main so that the progress of his/their work is not held up for want of water. No claim of damage or refund of water charges will be entertained on account of such break down.

CLAUSE 32

Alternate water arrangements

i. Where there is no piped water supply arrangement and the water is taken by the contractor from the wells or hand pump constructed by the AAI, no charge shall be recovered from the contractor or that account. The contractor shall, however, draw water at such hours of the day that it does not interfere with the normal use for which the hand pumps and well are intended. He will also be responsible for all damage and abnormal repairs arising out of his use, thecostofwhichshallberecoverablefromhim. The Engineer-in-Chargeshall be the final authority to determine the cost recoverable from the



contractor on this account and his decision shall be binding on the contractor.

ii. The contractor shall be allowed to construct temporary wells in AAI land for taking water for construction purposes only after he has got permission of the Engineer-in-Charge in writing. No charges shall be recovered from the contractor on this account but the contractor shall be required to provide necessary safety arrangements to avoid any accidents or damage to adjacent buildings, roads and service lines. He shall be responsible for any accidents or damage caused due to construction and subsequent maintenance of the wells and shall restore the ground to its original condition after the wells are dismantled on completion of the work.

CLAUSE33

Return of Surplus materials

Notwithstanding anything contained to the contrary in this contract, where any materials for the execution of the contract are procured with the assistance of AAI either by issue from AAI stocks or purchase made under orders or permits or licenses issued by AAI, the contractor shall hold the said materials economically and solely for the purpose of the contract and not dispose of them without the written permission of the AAI and return, if required by the engineer-in-Charge, all surplus or unserviceable materials that may be left with him after the completion of the contract or at its termination for any reason whatsoever on being paid or credited such prices as the Engineer-in-Charge shall determine having due regard to the condition of the materials. The price allowed to the contractor however shall not exceed the amount charged to him excluding the element of storage charges. The decision of the Engineer-in-Charge shall be final and conclusive. In the event of breach of the aforesaid condition, the contractor shall in addition to throwing himself open to action for contravention of the terms ofthelicenseorpermitand/orforcriminalbreachoftrust, beliableto AAIfor all moneys, advantages or profits resulting or which in the usual course would have resulted to him by reason of such breach.

CLAUSE34

Hire of plant & Machinery

- i. The Contractor shall arrange at his own expense all tools, plant, machinery and equipment(hereinafter referred to as T&P) required for execution of the work except for the Plant & Machinery listed in Schedule 'C' and stipulated for issue to the contractor. If the contractor requires any item of T&P on hire from the T&P available with the AAI over and above the T&P stipulated for issue, the AAI will, if such item is available, hire it to the contractor at rates to be agreed upon between him and the Engineer-in-charge. In such a case, all the conditions hereunder for issue of T & P shall also be applicable to such T&P as is agreed to be issued.
- ii. Plant & Machinery when supplied on hire charges shown in Schedule 'C' shall be made over and taken back at the departmental equipment yard / shed shown in Schedule 'C' and the contractor shall bear the cost of carriage from the place of issue to the site of work and back. The contractor shall be responsible to return the plant and machinery with condition in which it was handed over to him, and he shall be responsible for all damage caused to the said plant and machinery at the site of work or elsewhere in operation and otherwise during transit including damage to or loss of plant and for all losses due to his failure to return the same soon after the completion of the work for which it was issued. The Engineer-in-charge shall be the sole judge to determine the liability of the contractor and its extent in this regard and his decision shall be final and binding on the contractor.

Clauses of Contract

- iii. The plant and machinery as stipulated above will be issued as and when available and if required by the contractor. The contractor shall arrange his program of work according to the availability of the plant and machinery and no claim, whatsoever, will be entertained from him for any delay in supply by the department.
- iv. The hire charges shall be recovered at the prescribed rates from and inclusive of the date the plant and machinery made over up to and inclusive of the date of the return in good order even though the same may not have been working for any cause except major breakdown due to no fault of the contractor or faulty use requiring more than three working days continuously (excluding intervening holidays and Sundays) for bringing the plant in order. The contractor shall immediately intimate in writing to the Engineer-in-charge when any plant or machinery gets out of order requiring major repairs as aforesaid. The Engineer-in- charge shall record the date and time of receipt of such intimation in the log sheet of the plant or machinery. Based on this if the breakdown before lunch period or major breakdown will be computed considering half a day's breakdown on the day of complaint. If the breakdown occurs in the post lunch period of major breakdown will be computed starting from the next working day. In case of any dispute under this clause, the decision of the Executive Director (Eng.) /General Manager (Eng.) shall be final and binding on the contractor.
- v. The hire charges shown above are for each day of 8 hours (inclusive of the one hour lunch break) or part thereof.
- vi. Hire charges will include service of operating staff as required and also supply of lubricating oil and stores for cleaning purposes. Power fuel of approved type, firewood, kerosene oil etc. for running the plant and machinery and also the full time chaokidar for guarding the plant and machinery against any loss or damage shall be arranged by the contractor who shall be fully responsible for the safeguard and security of plant and machinery. The contractor shall on or before the supply of plant and machinery sign an agreement indemnifying the Department against any loss or damage caused to the plant and machinery either during transit or at site of work.
- vii. Ordinarily, no plant and machinery shall work for more than 8 hours a day inclusive of one hour lunch break. In case of an urgent work however, the Engineer-in charge may, at his discretion, allow the plant and machinery to be worked for more than normal period of 8 hours a day. In that case, the hourly hire charges for overtime to be borne by the contractor shall be 50% more than the normal proportionate hourly charges (1/8th of the daily charges) subject to a minimum of half day's normal charges on any particular day. For working out hire charges for over time, a period of half an hour and above will be charged as one hour and a period of less than half an hour will be ignored.
- viii. The contractor shall release the plant and machinery every seventh day for periodical servicing and / or wash out which may take about three to four hours or more. Hire charges for full day shall be recovered from the contractor for the day of servicing / wash out irrespective of the period employed in servicing.
- ix. The plant and machinery once issued to the contractor shall not be returned by him on account of lack of arrangements of labor and materials, etc. on his part, the same will be returned only when they are required for major repairs or when in the opinion of the Engineer-incharge, the work or a portion of work for which the same was issued is completed.
- x. Log Book for recording the hours of daily work for each of the plant and machinery supplied to the contractor will be maintained by the Department and will be countersigned by the contractor or his authorized agent daily.

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- case the contractor contests the correctness of the entries and / or fails to sign the Log Book, the decision of the Engineer-in-charge shall be final and binding on him. Hire charges will be calculated according to the entries in the Log Book and will be binding on the contractor. Recovery on account of hire charges for road rollers shall be made for the minimum number of days worked out on the assumption that a roller can consolidate per day and maximum quantity of materials or area surfacing as noted against each in the annexed statement (see attached annexure).
- xi. In the case of concrete mixers, the contractors shall arrange to get the hopper cleaned and the drum washed at the close of the work each day or each occasion. (a) In case rollers for consolidation are employed by the contractor himself, log book for such rollers shall be maintained in the same manner as is done in case of departmental rollers, maximum quantity of any items to be consolidated for each roller-day shall also be same as in Annexure to Clause 34(x). For less use of rollers, recovery for the less roller days shall be made at the stipulated issuerate.
- xii. The contractor shall be responsible to return the plant and machinery in the condition in which it was handed over to him and he shall be responsible for all damage caused to the said plant and machinery at the site of work or elsewhere in operation or otherwise or during transit including damage to or loss of parts, and for all losses due to his failure to return the same soon after the completion of the work for which it was issued. The Engineer-in-charge shall be the sole judge to determine the liability of the contractor and its extent in this regard and his decision shall be final and binding on the contractor.
- xiii. The contractor will be exempted from levy of any hire charges for the number of days he is called upon in writing by the Engineer-in-charge to suspend execution of the work, provided AAI's plant and machinery in question have, in fact, remained idle with the contractor because of the suspension.
- xiv. In the event of the contractor not requiring any item of plant and machinery issued by AAI though not stipulated for issue in Schedule 'C' any time after taking delivery at the place of issue, he may return it after two days written notice or at any time without notice if he agrees to pay hire charges for two additional days without, in any way, affecting the right of the Engineer-in- charge to use the said plant and machinery during the said period of two days as he likes including hiring out to a third party.

CLAUSE 36

Employment of Technical Staff and employees

Contractors Superintendence, Supervision, Technical staff & Employees

i. The contractor shall provide all necessary superintendence during execution of the work and all along thereafter as may be necessary for proper fulfilling of the obligations under the contract.

The Contractor shall immediately after receiving letter of acceptance of the tender and before commencement of the work, intimate in writing to the Engineer-in-Charge, the name (s), qualifications experience, age, address (s) and other particulars along with certificates, of the principal technical representative to be charge of the work and other technical representative (s) who will be supervising the work. Minimum requirement of such technical representative (s) and their qualifications and experience shall not be lower than specified in schedule 'F". The Engineer-in-Charge shall within 3 days of receipt of such communication intimate in writing his approval or otherwise of such a representative (s) to the contractor. Any such approval may at any time be withdrawn and in case of such withdrawal, the contractor shall appoint another such representative (s) according to the provisions of this clause. Decision of the tender accepting authority shall be final and binding on the contractor in this respect. Such a principal technical representative and other technical representative (s) shall be appointed by the contractor soon after receipt of the approval from Engineer-in-charge and shall be available at site before start of work.

All the provisions applicable to the principal technical representative under the clause will also be applicable to other technical representative(s). The principal technical representative and other technical representative (s) shall be present at the site of work for supervision at all times when any construction activity is in progress and also present himself/themselves, as required to the Engineer-in-Charge and / or his designated representative to take instructions. Instructions given to the principal technical representative or other technical representative (s) shall be deemed to have the same force as if these have been given to the contractor. The Principal Technical Representative and other technical representatives shall be actually available atsitefullyduringallstagesofexecutionwork,duringrecording/checking

/ test checking of measurements of works whenever so required by the Engineer-in-Charge and shall also note down instructions conveyed by the Engineer-in-Charge or his designated representative (s) in the site order book and shall affix his/their signature in token of noting down the instructions and in token of acceptance of measurements / checked measurements / test checked measurements. The representative (s) shall not look after any other work. Substitutes, duly approved by engineer — in-Charge of the work in similar manner as aforesaid shall be provided in event of absence of any of the representative (s) by more than two days. If the Engineer—in-Charge, whose decision in this respect is final and binding on the contractor, is convinced that no such technical representative (s) is/are effectively appointed or is/are effectively attending or fulfilling the provision of this clause, a recovery (non-refundable) shall be effected from the contractor as

specified in Schedule 'F' and the decision of the Engineer-in- Charge as recorded in the site order book and measurement recorded checked/test checked in Measurement Books shall be final and binding on the contractor. Further if the contractor fails to appoint suitable technical Principal technical representative and / or other technical representative (s) and if such appointed persons are not effectively present or are absent by more than two days without duly approved substitute or do not discharge their responsibility satisfactorily, the Engineer-in-Charge shall have full powers to suspend the execution of the work until such date as suitable other technical representative (s) is / are appointed and the contractor shall be held responsible for the delay so caused to the work. The contractor shall submit a certificate of employment of the technical representative (s) (in the form of copy of Form- 16 or CPF deduction issued to the Engineer employed by him) along with every running account bill / final bill and shall produce evidence if at any times so required by the Engineer-in-Charge.

- iii. The contractor shall provide and employ on the site only such technical assistants as are skilled, and experienced in their respective fields and such foremen and supervisory staff as are competent to give proper supervision to the work. The contractor shall provide and employ skilled, semi-skilled and unskilled labor as is necessary for proper and timely execution of the work. The Engineer-in-Charge shall be at liberty to object to and require the contractor to remove from the works any person who in his opinion misconducts himself, or is incompetent or negligent in the performance of his duties or whose employment is otherwise considered by the Engineer-in Charge to be undesirable. Such person shall not be employed again at works site without the written permission of the Engineer-in-Charge and the persons so removed shall be replaced as soon as possible by competent substitutes.
- iii. The contractor shall not change his engineer/supervisory staff after approval of the Engineer-In-Charge. If Contractor wants to replace any of his staff due to unavoidable circumstances, he will seek permission of Engineer-In- Charge indicating reasons for such change, qualification and experience of the alternative employee suggested by him. The qualification and experience of the alternative staff shall not be inferior to the person employed earlier.

CLAUSE 37

Levy/Taxes/
Royalty/
Land License
fee payable
by Contractor

1. Taxes:

- a. Rates to be quoted by the parties should be inclusive of all taxes, duties, CESS, fee, royalty charges etc. levied under any statute but exclusive of GST for all the items
- b. However GST, as applicable, shall be paid to the contractor, for any taxable supply / services / construction rendered by the agency to AAI, against a valid GST invoice as per terms and conditions of the contract.
- c. In case supplies /services / works involve imports; the same should be identified separately. Basic Custom Duty & IGST will be paid directly by AAI by utilizing EPCG license / Duty Credit Scrip under Service Export from India Scheme (SEIS) of Govt. of India.

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2. Royalty:

Clauses of Contract

- a. The contractor shall at his own expense, provide all materials required for the works other than those which are to be supplied by AAI. The contractor shall deposit royalty and obtain necessary permit for collection of stone, sand, red bajri, kankar etc. from the local authority in the matter and will abide by the notification issued by Central Govt. / State Government / Local State Authorities as applicable from time to time in this regard. The contractor is also bound to allow deduction from his bills any difference in statutory taxes/royalty and penalty proposed by Local State Authorities to AAI till finalization of settlement of all demands in this regard by Central / State Govt.
- b. This will also be applicable to forest produce.
- c. If pursuant to or under any law, notification or order any royalty, cess or the like becomes payable by the AAI and does not any time become payable by the contractor to the State Government. Local authorities in respect of any material used by the contractor in the works then in such a case, it shall be lawful to the AAI and it will have the right and be entitled to recover the amount paid in the circumstances as aforesaid from dues of the contractor.

3. License fee forland

- a. The contractor shall be liable to pay license fee for the land allotted by AAI for installation of plants, Labor camp, cement godown and site office at AAI prevailing rates of license fee for unpaved land at the time of call oftender.
- b. In addition a security deposit at the rate of Rs 500/- per sqm in the form of DD/BG shall also be deposited by the contractor. In case contractor do not deposit security deposit same shall be deducted from Ist Running AccountBill.
- Such security deposit—shall be released only after allotted land has been
 - fully vacated by the contractor to entire satisfaction of Engineer in Charge.

CLAUSE 38

Conditions for reimbursement of levy/taxes if levied after receipt of tenders 1.Rates to be quoted by the parties should be inclusive of all taxes, duties, CESS, fee, royalty charges etc. levied under any statute applicable on last stipulated date of receipt of tender including extension if any but exclusive of GST. No adjustment i.e. increase or decrease shall be made for any variation in the rate of GSI Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare Cess or any tax, levy or Cess applicable on inputs.

However, effect of variation, as per Govt. order after the last date of receipt of tender including extension if any, in rates of GST or Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare Cess or imposition or repeal of any other tax, levy or Cess applicable on output of the works contract shall be adjusted on either side, increase or decrease.

Provided further that for Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare Cess or any tax (other than GST), levy or Cess varied or imposed after the last date of receipt of tender including extension if any, any increase shall be reimbursed to the contractor only if the contractor necessarily and properly pays such increased amount of taxes / levies / Cess.

Provided further that such increase in tax / levy / Cess including GST shall not reimbursed if made in the extended period of contract for which the contractor alone is responsible for delay as determined by authority for extension of time under Clause 5 in Schedule F.

2. The contractor shall keep necessary books of accounts and other documents for the purpose of this condition as may be necessary and shall allow inspection of the same by a duly authorized representative of AAI or the Engineer-in-Charge and further shall furnish such other information /document as the Engineer-in-
Charge may require from time to time. 3. The contractor shall, within a period of 30 days of the imposition of any such further tax or levy or Cess, give a written notice thereof to the Engineer-incharge that the same is given pursuant to the condition, together with all necessary information / documents relating thereto.

CLAUSE39

Termination of
contract on
death of
contractor

Without prejudice to any of the rights or remedies under this contract, if the contractor dies, the Engineer-in-charge on behalf of the AAI shall have the option of terminating the contract without compensation to the contractor.

CLAUSE40

If relative working in AAI then the contractor not allowed to tender.

The contractor shall not be permitted to tender for works in AAI wherein his near relative is posted as an Officer responsible for award and execution of work. He shall also intimate the names of persons who are working with him in any capacity or / are subsequently employed by him and who are near relatives to any officer of AAI. Any breach of this condition by the Contractor would render him, the contract liable to be rejected at any stage.

NOTE: By the term "near relatives" is meant wife, husband, parents and grand parents, children and grandchildren, brothers and sisters, uncles, aunts and cousins and their corresponding in-laws.

Engineer or any officer employed in engineering or administrative duties in an engineering department of AAI shall not work as a contractor or employee of contractor for a period of one year after his retirement from AAI service without the prior permission of AAI in writing. This contract is liable to be cancelled if either the contractor or any of his employees is found at any time to be such a person who had not obtained the permission of AAI as aforesaid, before submission of the tender or engagement in the contractor's service, as the case may be.



CLAUSE 41(a)

Integrity Pact
and
Independent
External
Monitor.

Signing of Integrity Pact (As per Appendix XVIII) is mandatory for every bidder/contractor if provided so in Schedule F.

All tenderers shall have to submit an undertaking as per Appendix II along with tender documents. AAI shall appoint Independent Extern nitor(s) to oversee effective implementation of Integrity Pact for such completes. For this purpose, a panel of Independent External Monitors statement of the Authority in concurrence with Central Vigilance Company (CVC).

- i. The Contractor/Supplier shall have to act in a dance with the conditions laid down in the integritypact.
 - a. Signing of Integrity Pact is most tory for every Bidder/Contractor in this procurement/bid processing and original pact to be send to the office of Bid Manager as should reach before the due date mentioned in NIT.
 - b. The Bidder/co tranship shall commit itself to ensure taking all measures not to prevent corrupt practices, unfair means and illegal action during any stage of its bid or during any pre-contract or point act stage as specified in section 3 of the integritypact.
 - c. b ach of the aforesaid provisions by the Bidder or any one expected by it or acting on its behalf (whether with or without the knowledge of the Bidder) shall entitle the authority to take all or any one of the action as specified in section 6 of the integrity pact.
- ii. In case any violation of above conduct is established, AAI reserves right to take following actions.
 - a. If contractor commits a violation of its commitments and obligations under the Integrity Pact Program during bidding process, he shall be liable for disqualification from tender process and forfeiture of his Earnest Money Deposit/ Bid Security.
 - b. In case of violation of the Integrity Pact after award of the contract, Authority is entitled to terminate the contract and shall be entitled to demand and recover from the contractor damages equivalent to 5% of the contract value or the amount equivalent to Security Deposit or Performance Bank Guarantee, whichever is higher.
 - c. Authority may initiate appropriate proceedings against the contractor.
 - d. Contractor will be liable to pay damages as determined by the Authority.
 - e. Contractor against whom an action for violation of its commitments and obligations has been taken earlier again commits a violation, the Authority is entitled to debar such contractor for future tender/contract processes for a period as deemed fit.

Return of material and recovery for excess material issued.

- i. After completion of the work and also at any intermediate stage in the event of non-reconciliation of materials issued, consumed and in balance (see Clause 10), Theoretical quantity of materials issued by the AAI for use in the work shall be calculated on the basis and method given hereunder;
 - a. Quantity of cement & bitumen shall be calculated on the basis of quantity of cement & bitumen required for different items of work as shown in the Schedule of Rates mentioned in Schedule 'F'. In case any item is executed for which standard co-efficient for the consumption of cement or bitumen are not available in the above mentioned schedule / statement or cannot be derived from the same shall be calculated on the basis of standard formula to be laid down by the Engineer-in-Charge.
 - b. Theoretical quantity of steel reinforcement or structural steel sections shall be taken as the quantity required as per design or as authorized by Engineer-in- Charge, including authorized lap pages, chairs etc. plus 3% wastage due to cutting into pieces, such theoretical quantity being determined and compared with the actual issues each diameter-wise, section wise and category wise separately.
 - c. Theoretical quantity of G.I. & C.I. or other pipes, conduits, wires and cables pig lead and G.I. / M.S. sheets shall be taken as quantity actually required and measures plus 5% for wastage due to cutting into pieces (except in the case of G.I./M.S. sheets it shall be 10%), such determination & comparison being made diameter-wise &category-wise.
 - d. For any other material as per actual requirements.
- ii. Over the theoretical quantities of materials so computed a variation shall be allowed as specified in Schedule 'F'. The difference in the net quantities of material actually issued to the contractor and the theoretical quantities including such authorized variation, if not returned by the contractor or if not fully reconciled to the satisfaction of the Engineer-in-Charge within fifteen days of the issue of written notice by the Engineer-in-Charge to this effect shall be recovered at the rates specified in Schedule 'F', without prejudice to the provision of the relevant conditions regarding return of materials governing the contract. Decision of Engineer-in-Charge in regard to theoretical quantities of materials, which should have been actually used as per the Annexure of the standard schedule of rates and recovery at rates specified in Schedule 'F' shall be final and binding on the contractor. For non scheduled items, the decision of the Engineer in charge regarding theoretical quantities of materials which should have been actually used, shall be final and binding on the contractor.
- g. The said action under this clause is without prejudice to the right of the AAI to take action against the contractor under any other conditions of contract for not doing the work according to the prescribed specifications.
- h. For materials brought by the contractor for use in item of work at site, similar theoretical consumption shall be prepared and submitted to the Engineer-in-Charge for verification. If it is found that material consumed in the work is less than the theoretical consumption after taking into account permissible minus variation, the recovery for corresponding material shall be effected as per rates specified in schedule 'F' under Clause 42.



CLAUSE43

Compensation during warlike situations / act of terrorism

The work (whether fully constructed or not) and all materials, machines, tools and plants scaffolding, temporary buildings and other things connected therewith shall be at the risk of the contractor until the work has been delivered to the Engineer-in-Charge and a certificate from him to that effect obtained. In the event of the work or any materials properly brought to the site for incorporation in the work being damaged or destroyed in consequence of hostilities or warlike operation or act of terrorism, the contractor shall when ordered (in writing) by the Engineer-in-Charge to remove any debris from the site, collect and properly stack or remove in store all serviceable materials salvaged from the damaged work and shall be paid at the contract rates in accordance with the provision of this agreement for the work of clearing the site of debris, stacking or removal of serviceable material and for reconstruction of all works ordered by the Engineer- in-Charge, such payments being in addition to compensation upto the value of the work original executed before being damaged or destroyed and not paid for.

In case of works damaged or destroyed but not already measured and paid for, the compensation shall be assessed by the Engineer-in charge upto Rs.5,000/- and by the Executive Director Engg. concerned for a higher amount. The contractor shall be paid for the damages / destruction suffered and for restoring the material at the rate based on analysis of rates tendered for in accordance with the provision of the contract. The certificate of the Engineer-in- Charge regarding the quality and quantity of materials and the purpose for which they were collected shall be final and binding on all parties to this contract.

Provided always that no compensation shall be payable for any loss in consequence of hostilities or warlike operation (a) unless the contractor had taken all such precautions against air raid as are deemed necessary by the A.R.P. Officers or the Engineer-in- Charge (b) for any material etc. not on the site of the work or for any tools plant, machinery, scaffolding, temporary building and other things not intended for the work.

In the event of the contractor having to carry out reconstruction as aforesaid, he

shall be allowed such extension of time for its completion as is considered reasonable by the Engineer – in - charge.

SAFETY CODE

- 1. Suitable Scaffolds should be provided for workmen for all works that cannot safely be done from the ground, or from solid construction except such short period work as can be done safely from ladders. When a ladder is used, an extra mazdoor shall be engaged for holding the ladder and if the ladder is used for carrying materials as well suitable footholds and hand-hold shall be provided on the ladder and the ladder shall be given an inclination not steeper than ½ to 1 (¼ horizontal and 1vertical).
- 2. Scaffolding of staging more than 3.6m (12ft.) above the ground or floor, swung or suspended from an overhead support or erected with stationary support shall have a guard rail properly attached or bolted, braced and otherwise secured at least 90 cm. (3ft.) high above the floor or platform of such scaffolding on staging and extending along the entire length of the outside and ends thereof with only such opening as may be necessary for the delivery of materials. Such scaffolding or staging shall be so fastened as to prevent it from swaying from the building orstructure.
- 3. Working platforms, gangways and stairways should be so constructed that they should not sag unduly or unequally, and if the height of the platform or the gangway or the stairway is more than 3.6 m (12ft.) above ground level or floor level, they should be closely boarded, should have adequate width and should be suitably fastened as described in (2)above.
- 4. Every opening in the floor of a building or in a working platform shall be provided with suitable means to prevent the fall of person or materials by providing suitable fencing or railing whose minimum height shall be 90cm.(3ft.)
- 5. Safe means of access shall be provided to all working platforms and other working places. Every ladder shall be securely fixed. No portable single ladder shall be over 9m. (30ft.) in length while the width between side rails in rung ladder shall in no case be less than 29 cm. (11 ½ ") for ladder upto and including 3m. (10ft.) in length. For long ladders, this width should be increased at least ¼" for each additional 30cm. (1 foot) of length. Uniform step spacing of not more than 30cm shall be kept. Adequate precautions shall be taken to prevent danger from electrical equipment. No materials on any of the site or work shall be so stacked or placed as to cause danger or inconvenience to any person or the public. The contractor shall provide all necessary fencing and lights to protect the public from accident and shall be bound to bear the expenses of defence of every suit, action or other proceedings at law that may be brought by any person for injury sustained owing to neglect of the above precautions and to pay any damages and cost which may be awarded in any such suit, action or proceedings to any such person on which may, with the consent of the contractor, be paid to compensate any claim by any such person.
- 6. a. **Excavation and Trenching** All trenches 1.2 m. (4ft.) or more in depth, shall at all times be supplied with at least one ladder for each 30m. (100ft.) in length or fraction thereof, Ladder shall extend from bottom of the Trench to at least 90cm (3fts) above the surface of the ground. The side of the trenches which are 1.5 m. (5 ft.) or more in depth shall be stepped back to give suitable slope or securely held by timber bracing, so as to avoid the danger of sides collapsing. The excavated material shall not be placed within 1.5 m. (5 ft.) of the edges of the trench or half of the depth of the trench whichever is more. Cutting shall be done from top to bottom. Under no circumstances, undermining or undercutting shall bedone.



b. Safety Measures for digging bore holes:

- i. If the bore well is successful, it should be safely capped to avoid caving and collapse of the bore well. The failed and the abandoned ones should be completely refilled to avoid caving and collapse;
- ii. During drilling, Sign boards should be erected near the site with the address of the drilling contractor and the Engineer in charge of thework;
- iii. Suitable fencing should be erected around the well during the drilling and after the installation of the rig on the point of drilling, flags shall be put 50 Mtr all around the point of drilling to avoid entry of people/animals:
- iv. After drilling the bore well, a cement platform (0.50 Mtr x 0.50 Mtr x 1.20 Mtr) 0.60 Mtr above ground level and 0.60 Mtr below ground level should be constructed around the wellcasing;
- v. After the completion of the bore well, the contractor should cap the bore well properly by welding steel plate, cover the bore well with the drilled wet soil and fix thorny shrubs over the soil. This should be done even while repairing thepump;
- vi. After the bore well is drilled the entire site should be brought to the groundlevel;
- 7. Demolition Before any demolition work is commenced and also during the progress of the work.
 - i) All roads and open areas adjacent to the work site shall either be closed or suitably protected.
 - ii) No electric cable or apparatus which is liable to be a source of danger or a cable or apparatus used by the operator shall remain electrically charged.
 - iii) All practical steps shall be taken to prevent danger to persons employed from risk of fire or explosion or flooding. No floor, roof or other part of the building shall be so overloaded with debris or materials as to render itunsafe.
- 8. All necessary personal safety equipment as considered adequate by the Engineer-in-Charge should be kept available for the use of the person employed on the site and maintained in a condition suitable for immediate use, and the contractor should take adequate steps to ensure proper use of equipment by those concerned. The following safety equipment shall invariably be provided.
 - i) Workers employed on mixing asphaltic materials, cement and lime mortars shall be provided with protective footwear and protective goggles.
 - ii) Those engaged in white washing and mixing or stacking of cement bags or any material which is injurious to the eyes shall be provided with protectivegoggles.
 - iii) Those engaged in welding works shall be provided with welder's protective eye-shields.
 - iv) Stone breaker shall be provided with protective goggles and protective clothing and seated at sufficiently safeintervals.
 - w) When workers are employed in sewers and manholes, which are in active use, the contractors shall ensure that the manhole covers are opened and ventilated at least for an hour before the workers are allowed to get into the manholes, and the manholes so opened shall be cordoned off with suitable railing and provided with warning signals or boards to prevent accident to the public. In addition, the contractor shall ensure that the following safety measures are adhered to:
 - a) Entry for workers into the line shall not be allowed except under supervision of the Sr.Superintendent (Engg.) or any other higherofficer.
 - b) At least 5 to 6 manholes upstream and downstream should be kept open for at least 2 to 3 hours before any man is allowed to enter into the manhole for workinginside.
 - e) Before entry, presence of toxic gases should be tested by inserting wet lead acetate paper which changes colour in the presence of such gases and gives indication of their presence.



- d) Presence of Oxygen should be verified by lowering a detector lamp into the manhole. In case, no Oxygen is found inside the sewer line, workers should be sent only with oxygen kit.
- e) Safety belt with rope should be provided to the workers. While working inside the manholes, such rope should be handled by two men standing outside to enable him to be pulled out duringemergency.
- f) The area should be barricaded or condoned off by suitable means to avoid mishaps of any kind. Proper warning signs should be displayed for the safety of the public whenever cleaning works are undertaken during night orday.
- g) No smoking or open flames shall be allowed near the blocked manhole beingcleaned.
- h) The malba obtained on account of cleaning of blocked manholes and sewer lines should be immediately removed to avoid accidents on account of slippery nature of themalba.
- i) Workers should not be allowed to work inside the manhole continuously. He should be given rest intermittently. The Engineer in Charge may decide the time upto which a worker may be allowed to work continuously inside themanhole.
- j) Gas masks with Oxygen Cylinder should be kept at site for use inemergency.
- k) Air blowers should be used for flow of fresh air through the manholes. Whenever called for, portable air blowers are recommended for ventilating the manholes. The Motors for these shall be vapour proof and of totally enclosed type. Non sparking gas engines also could be used but they should be placed at least 2 meters away from the opening and on the leeward side protected from wind so that they will not be a source of friction on any inflammable gas that might bepresent.
- l) The workers engaged for cleaning the manholes / sewers should be properly trained before allowing to work in themanhole.
- m) The workers shall be provided with Gumboots or non sparking shoes bump helmets and gloves non sparking tools safety lights and gas masks and portable air blowers (when necessary). They must be supplied with barrier cream for anointing the limbs before working inside the sewerlines.
- n) Workmen descending a manhole shall try each ladder stop or rung carefully before putting his full weight on it to guard against insecure fastening due to corrosion of the rung fixed to manholewell.
- o) If a man has received a physical injury, he should be brought out of the sewer immediately and adequate medical aid should be provided tohim.
- p) The extent to which these precautions are to be taken depend on individual situation but the decision of the Engineer-in-Charge regarding the steps to be taken in this regard in an individual case will be final.
- (vi) The Contractor shall not employ men and women below the age of 18 years on the work of painting with products containing lead in any form. Wherever men above the age of 18 are employed on the work of lead painting, the following precaution should be taken:-
- a) No paint containing lead or lead products shall be used except in the form of paste or readymadepaint.
- b) Suitable face masks should be supplied for use by the workers when paint is applied in the form of spray or a surface having lead paint is dry rubbed andscrapped.
- c) Overall shall be supplied by the contractors to the workmen and adequate facilities shall be provided to enable the working painters to wash during and on the cessation ofwork.
- 9. An additional clause (viii)(i) of AAI Safety Code (iv) the Contractor shall not employ women and men below the age of 18 on the work of painting with product containing lead in any form, wherever men above the age of 18 are employed on the work of lead painting, the following principles must be observed for suchuse:
 - i) White lead, sulphate of lead or product containing these pigment, shall not be used in painting operation except in the form of pastes or paint ready foruse.
 - ii) Measures shall be taken, wherever required in order to prevent danger arising from the application of a paint in the form ofspray.



- iii) Measures shall be taken, wherever practicable, to prevent danger arising out of from dust caused by dry rubbing down andscraping.
- iv) Adequate facilities shall be provided to enable working painters to wash during and on cessation ofwork.
- v) Overall shall be worn by working painters during the whole of workingperiod.
- vi) Suitable arrangement shall be made to prevent clothing put off during working hours being spoiled by paintingmaterials.
- vii) Cases of lead poisoning and suspected lead poisoning shall be notified and shall be subsequently verified by medical man appointed by competent authority of AAI.
- viii) AAI may require, when necessary medical examination ofworkers.
- ix) Instructions with regard to special hygienic precautions to be taken in the painting trade shall be distributed to workingpainters.
- 10. When the work is done near any place where there is risk of drowning, all necessary equipments should be provided and kept ready for use and all necessary steps taken for prompt rescue of any person in danger and adequate provision, should be made for prompt first aid treatment of all injuries likely to be obtained during the course of thework.
- 11. Use of hoisting machines and tackle including their attachments, anchorage and supports shall conform to the following standards or conditions:
 - i) (a) These shall be of good mechanical construction, sound materials and adequate strength and free from patent defects and shall be kept repaired and in good working order.
 - (b) Every rope used in hoisting or lowering materials or as a means of suspension shall be of durable quality and adequate strength, and free from patent defects.
 - ii) Every crane driver or hoisting appliance operator shall be properly qualified and no person under the age of 21 years should be in charge of any hoisting machine including any scaffolding winch or give signals tooperator.
 - iii) In case of every hoisting machine and of every chain ring hook, shackle swivel and pulley block used in hoisting or as means of suspension, the safe working load shall be ascertained by adequate means. Every hoisting machine and all gear referred to above shall be plainly marked with the safe working load. In case of a hoisting machine having a variable safe working load each safe working load and the condition under which it is applicable shall be clearly indicated. No part of any machine or any gear referred to above in this paragraph shall be loaded beyond the safe working load except for the purpose of testing.
 - iv) In case of departmental machines, the safe working load shall be notified by the Electrical Engineer-in-Charge. As regards contractor's machines the contractors shall notify the safe working load of the machine to the Engineer-in-Charge whenever he brings any machinery to site of work and get it verified by the electrical Engineerconcerned.
- 12. Motors, gearing, transmission, electric wiring and other dangerous parts of hoisting appliances should be provided with efficient safeguards. Hoisting appliances should be provided with such means as will reduce to the minimum the risk of accidental descent of the load. Adequate precautions should be taken to reduce to the minimum the risk of any part of a suspended load becoming accidentally displaced. When workers are employed on electrical installations which are already energized, insulating mats, wearing apparel, such as gloves, sleeves and boots as may be necessary should be provided. The worker should not wear any rings, watches and carry keys or other materials which are good conductors of electricity.
- 13. All scaffolds, ladders and other safety devices mentioned or described herein shall be maintained in safe condition and no scaffold, ladder or equipment shall be altered or removed while it is in use. Adequate washing facilities should be provided at or near places ofwork.



- 14. These safety provisions should be brought to the notice of all concerned by display on a notice board at a prominent place at work spot. The person responsible for compliance of the safety code shall be named therein by the contractor.
- 15. To ensure effective enforcement of the rules and regulations relating to safety precautions the arrangements made by the contractor shall be open to inspection by the Labor Officer or Engineer-in- Charge of the department or their representatives.
- 16. Notwithstanding the above clauses from (1) to (15), there is nothing in these to exempt the contractor from the operations of any other Act or Rules in force in the Republic ofIndia.



MODEL RULES FOR THE PROTECTION OF HEALTH AND SANITARY ARRANGEMENTS FORWORKERS EMPLOYED BY AAI OR ITS CONTRACTORS

1. APPLICATION

These rules shall apply to all buildings and construction works in charge of AAI in which twenty or more workers are ordinarily employed or are proposed to be employed in any day during the period during which the contract work is in progress.

2. **DEFINITION**

Work place means a place where twenty or more workers are ordinarily employed in connection with construction work on any day during the period during which the contract work is in progress.

3. FIRST-AIDFACILITIES

- (i) At every work place, there shall be provided and maintained, so as to be easily accessible during working hours, first-aid boxes at the rate of not less than one box for 150 contract Labor or part thereof ordinarily employed.
- (ii) The first-aid box shall be distinctly marked with a red cross on white back ground and shall contain the following equipment.
- (a) For work places in which the number of contract Labor employed does not exceed 50 Each first –aid box shall contain the following equipments:
- 1. 6 small sterilizeddressings
- 2. 3 medium size sterilizeddressings
- 3. 3 large size sterilizeddressings
- 4. 3 large sterilized burndressings
- 5. 1 (30 ml) bottle containing a two per cent alcoholic solution ofiodine.
- 6. 1 (30 ml) bottle containing salvolatile having the dose and mode of administration indicated on the label.
- 7. 1 snakebitelancet.
- 8. 1 (30 gms) bottle of potassium permanganatecrystals.
- 9. 1 pairscissors.
- 10. 1copy of the first-aid leaflet issued by the Director General, Factory Advice Service and Labor Institute, Government of India.
- 11. 1 bottle containing 100 tablets (each of 5 gms) of aspirin.
- 12. Ointment for burns.
- 13. A bottle of suitable surgical antiseptic solution.
- (b) For work places in which the number of contract Labor exceed 50. Each first-aid box shall contain the following equipments.
- 1. 12 small sterilized dressings.
- 2. 6 medium size sterilizeddressings.
- 3. 6 large size sterilizeddressings
- 4. 6 large size sterilized burndressings.
- 5. 6 (15 gms) packets sterilized cotton wool.
- 6. 1 (60 ml). Bottle containing two per cent alcoholic solutioniodine.
- 7. 1 (60 ml) bottle containing salvolatile having the dose and mode of administration indicated on the label.
- 8. 1 roll of adhesiveplaster.
- 9. 1 snake bitelancet.
- 10. 1 (30 gms) bottle of potassium permanganatecrystals.
- 11. 1 pairscissors.
- 12. 1 copy of the first-aid leaflet issued by the Director General Factory Advice Service and Labor Institute / Government ofIndia.
- 13. A bottle containing 100 tablets (each of 5 gms) of aspirin.



- 14. Ointment for burns.
- 15. A bottle of suitable surgical antisepticsolution.
- (iii) Adequate arrangements shall be made for immediate recoupment of the equipment when necessary.
- (iv) Nothing except the prescribed contents shall be kept in the First-aidbox.
- (v) The first-aid box shall be kept in charge of a responsible person who shall always be readily available during the working hours of the workplace.
- (vi) a person in charge of the First-aid box shall be a person trained in First-aid treatment in the work places where the number of contract Labor employed is 150 ormore.
- (vii) In work places where the number of contract Labor employed is 500 or more and hospital facilities are not available within easy distance from the works. First-aid posts shall be established and run by a trained compounder. The compounder shall be on duty and shall be available at all hours when the workers are atwork.
- (viii) Where work places are situated in places which are not towns or cities, a suitable motor transport shall be kept readily available to carry injured person or person suddenly taken ill to the nearesthospital.

4. DRINKINGWATER

- i) In every work place, there shall be provided and maintained at suitable places, easily accessible to Labor, a sufficient supply of cold water fit fordrinking.
- ii) Where drinking water is obtained from an intermittent public water supply, each work place shall be provided with storage where such drinking water shall bestored.
- iii) Every water supply or storage shall be at a distance of not less than 50 feet from any latrine drain or other source of pollution. Where water has to be drawn from an existing well which is within such proximity of latrine, drain or any other source of pollution, the well shall be properly chlorinated before water is drawn from it for drinking. All such wells shall be entirely closed in and be provided with a trap door which shall be dust andwaterproof.
- iv) A reliable pump shall be fitted to each covered well, the trap door shall be kept locked and opened only for cleaning or inspection which shall be done at least once amonth.

5. WASHINGFACILITIES

- i) In every work place adequate and suitable facilities for washing shall be provided and maintained for the use of contract Labor employed therein.
- ii) Separate and adequate cleaning facilities shall be provided for the use of male and femal workers.
- iii) Such facilities shall be conveniently accessible and shall be kept in clean and hygienic condition.

6. LATRINES ANDURINALS

- i) Latrines shall be provided in every work place on the following scalenamely:
 - a) Where female are employed, there shall be at least one latrine for every 25females.
 - b) Where males are employed, there shall be at least one latrine for every 25males.
- ii) Provided that, where the number of males or females exceeds 100, it shall be sufficient if there is one latrine for 25 males or females as the case may be upto the first 100, and one for every 50thereafter.
- iii) Every latrine shall be under cover and so partitioned off as to secure privacy, and shall have a proper door and fastenings.
- iv) Construction of latrines: The inside walls shall be constructed of masonry or some suitable heat-resisting nonabsorbent materials and shall be cement washed inside and outside at least once a year, Latrines shall not be of a standard lower than boreholesystem.



- v) (a) Where workers of both sexes are employed, there shall be displayed outside each block of latrine and urinal, a notice in the language understood by the majority of the workers "For Men only" or "For Women Only" as the case maybe.
 - (b) The notice shall also bear the figure of a man or of a woman, as the case may be.
- vi) There shall be at least one urinal for male workers upto 50 and one for female workers upto fifty employed at a time, provided that where the number of male or female workmen, as the case may be exceeds 500, it shall be sufficient if there is one urinal for every 50 males or females upto the first 500 and one for every 100 or partthereafter.
- vii) (a) The latrines and urinals shall be adequately lighted and shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition at alltimes.
 - (b) Latrines and urinals other than those connected with a flush sewage system shall comply with the requirements of the Public Health Authorities.
- viii) Water shall be provided by means of tap or otherwise so as to be conveniently accessible in or near the latrines andurinals.
- Disposal of excreta: Unless otherwise arranged for by the local sanitary authority, arrangements for proper disposal of excreta by incineration at the work place shall be made by means of a suitable incinerator. Alternately excreta may be disposed of by putting a layer of night soil at the bottom of a pucca tank prepared for the purpose and covering it with a 15 cm. Layer of waste or refuse and then covering it with a layer of earth for a fortnight (when it will turn tomanure).
- x) The contractor shall at his own expense, carry out all instructions issued to him by the Engineer-in-Charge to effect proper disposal of night soil and other conservancy work in respect of the contractor's workmen or employees on the site. The contractor shall be responsible for payment of any charges which may be levied by Municipal or Cantonment Authority for execution of such on hisbehalf.

7. PROVISION OF SHELTER DURINGREST

At every place there shall be provided, free of cost, four suitable sheds, two for meals and the other two for rest separately for the use of men and women Labor. The height of each shelter shall not be less than 3 meters (10 ft.) from the floor level to the lowest part of the roof. These shall be kept clean and the space provided shall be on the basis of 0.6 sq.m. (6 sft) per head. Provided that the Engineer-in-Charge may permit subject to his satisfaction, a portion of the building under construction or other alternative accommodation to be used for the purpose.

8. CRECHES

- i) At every work place, at which 20 or more women workers are ordinarily employed, there shall be provided two rooms of reasonable dimensions for the use of their children under the age of six years. One room shall be used as a play room for the children and the other astheirbedroom. Theroomsshall be constructed with specifications as perclause 19H (ii) a,b & c.
- ii) The rooms shall be provided with suitable and sufficient openings for light and ventilation. There shall be adequate provision of sweepers to keep the placesclean.
- iii) The contractor shall supply adequate number of toys and games in the play room and sufficient number of cots and beddings in the bedroom.
- iv) The contractor shall provide one ayaa to look after the children in the crèche when the number of women workers does not exceed 50 and two when the number of women workers exceed 50.
- v) The use of the rooms earmarked as crèches shall be restricted to children, their attendants and mothers of thechildren.



9. CANTEENS

- i) In every work place where the work regarding the employment of contractor Labor is likely to continue for six months and where in contract Labor numbering one hundred or more are ordinarily employed, an adequate canteen shall be provided by the contractor for the use of such contractLabor.
- ii) The canteen shall be maintained by the contractor in an efficientmanner.
- iii) The canteen shall consist of at least a dining hall, kitchen, storeroom, pantry and washing places separately for workers andutensils.
- iv) The canteen shall be sufficiently lighted at all times when any person has access toit.
- v) The floor shall be made of smooth and impervious materials and inside walls shall be limewashed or colour washed at least once in each year. Provided that the inside walls of the kitchen shall be lime washed every fourmonths.
- vi) The premises of the canteen shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition.
- vii) Waste water shall be carried away in suitable covered drains and shall not be allowed to accumulate so as to cause anuisance.
- viii) Suitable arrangements shall be made for the collection and disposal of garbage.
- ix) The dining hall shall accommodate at a time 30 per cent of the contract Labor working at atime.
- x) The floor area of the dining hall, excluding the area occupied by the service counter and any furniture except tables and chairs shall not be less than one square metre (10 sft) per diner to be accommodated as prescribed in sub-Rule(ix).
- xi) (a) A portion of the dining hall and service counter shall be partitioned off and reserved for women workers in proportion to their number. (b) Washing places for women shall be separate and screened to secure privacy.
- xii) Sufficient tables stools, chairs or benches shall be available for the number of diners to be accommodated as prescribed in sub-Rule (ix).
- xiii) (a) 1. There shall be provided and maintained sufficient utensils crockery, furniture and any other equipment necessary for the efficient running of the canteen.
 - 2. The furniture utensils and other equipment shall be maintained in a clean and hygienic condition.
 - (b) 1. Suitable clean clothes for the employees serving in the canteen shall be provided and maintained.
 - 2. A service counter, if provided, shall have top of smooth and impervious material.
 - 3. Suitable facilities including an adequate supply of hot water shall be provided for the cleaning of utensils and equipments.
- xiv) The food stuffs and other items to be served in the canteen shall be in conformity with the normal habits of the contract Labor.
- xv) The charges for food stuffs, beverages and any other items served in the canteen shall be based on 'No Profit, No loss' and shall be conspicuously displayed in the canteen.
- xvi) In arriving at the price of foodstuffs, and other article served in the canteen, the following items shall not be taken into consideration as expenditure namely:
 - a) The rent of land andbuilding.
 - b) The depreciation and maintenance charges for the building and equipments provided for the canteen.
 - c) The cost of purchase, repairs and replacement of equipments including furniture, crockery, cutlery and utensils.
 - d) The water charges and other charges incurred for lighting and ventilation.
 - e) The interest and amounts spent on the provision and maintenance of equipments provided for the canteen.
- xvii) The accounts pertaining to the canteen shall be audited once every 12 months by registered accountants and auditors.



10. ANTI-MALARIALPRECAUTIONS

The contractor shall at his own expense, conform to all anti-malarial instructions given to him by the Engineer-in-Charge including the filling up of any borrow pits which may have been dug by him.

11. The above rules shall be incorporated in the contracts and in notices inviting tenders and shall form an integral part of the contracts.

12. AMENDMENTS

AAI may, from time to time, add to or amend these rules and issue directions - it may consider necessary for the purpose of removing any difficulty which may arise in the administration thereof.



AIRPORTS AUTHORITY OF INDIA Contractor's Labor Regulations

1. SHORTTITLE

These regulations may be called the AAI Contractors Labor Regulations.

2. **DEFINITIONS**

- (i) **Workman** means any person employed by AAI or its contractor directly or indirectly through a subcontractor with or without the knowledge of the AAI to do any skilled, semiskilled or unskilled manual, supervisory, technical or clerical work for hire or reward, whether the terms of employment are expressed or implied but does not include any person:-
- a) Who is employed mainly in a managerial or administrative capacity:or
- b) Who, being employed in a supervisory capacity draws wages exceeding five hundred rupees per mensem or exercises either by the nature of the duties attached to the office or by reason of powers vested in him, functions mainly of managerial nature :or
- c) Who is an out worker, that is to say, person to whom any article or materials are given out by or on behalf of the principal employers to be made up cleaned, washed, altered, ornamental finished, repaired adopted or otherwise processed for sale for the purpose of the trade or business of the principal employers and the process is to be carried out either in the home of the out worker or in some other premises, not being premises under the control and management of the principal employer. No person below the age of 14 years shall be employed to act as aworkman.
- (ii) Fair Wages means wages whether for time or piece work fixed and notified under the provisions of the Minimum Wages Act from time totime.
- (iii) **Contractors** shall include every person who undertakes to produce a given result other than a mere supply of goods or articles of manufacture through contract Labor or who supplies contract Labor for any work and includes asubcontractor.
- (iv) **Wages** shall have the same meaning as defined in the Payment of WagesAct.
- 3. i) Normally working hours of an adult employee should not exceed 9 hours a day. The working day shall be so arranged that inclusive of interval for rest, if any, it shall not spread over more than 12 hours on anyday.
 - ii) When an adult worker is made to work for more than 9 hours on any day or for more than 48 hours in any week, he shall be paid over time for the extra hours put in by him at double the ordinary rate ofwages.
 - iii) a) Every worker shall be given a weekly holiday normally on a Sunday, in accordance with the provisions of the Minimum Wages (Central) Rules 1960 as amended from time to time irrespective of whether such worker is governed by the Minimum Wages Act ornot.
 - b) Where the minimum wages prescribed by the Central/State Government under the Minimum Wages Act are not inclusive of the wages for the weekly day of rest, the worker shall be entitled to rest day wages at the rate applicable to the next preceding day, provided he has worked under the same contractor for a continuous period of not less than 6days.
 - c) Where a contractor is permitted by the Engineer-in-Charge to allow a worker to work on a normal weekly holiday, he shall grant a substituted holiday to him for the whole day on one of the five days immediately before or after the normal weekly holiday and pay wages to such worker for the work performed on the normal weekly holiday at overtimerate.

4. DISPLAY OF NOTICE REGARDING WAGESETC.

The contractor shall before he commences his work on contract, display and correctly maintain and continue to display and correctly maintain in a clear and legible condition in conspicuous places on the work, notices in English and in the local Indian languages spoken by the majority of the workers giving the minimum rates of wages fixed under Minimum Wages Act, the actual wages being paid, the hours of work for which such wage are earned, wages periods, dates of payments of wages and other relevant information as per Appendix'VIII'.

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5. PAYMENT OFWAGES

- (i) The contractor shall fix wage periods in respect of which wages shall be payable.
- (ii) No wage period shall exceed onemonth.
- (iii) The wages of every person employed as contract Labor in an establishment or by a contractor where less than one thousand such persons are employed shall be paid before the expiry of seventh day and in other cases before the expiry of tenth day after the last day of the wage period in respect of which the wages are payable.
- (iv) Where the employment of any worker is terminated by or on behalf of the contractor the wages earned by him shall be paid before the expiry of the second working day from the date on which his employment isterminated.
- (v) All payment of wages shall be made on a working day at the work premises and during the working time and on a date notified in advance and in case the work is completed before the expiry of the wage period, final payment shall be made within 48 hours of the last working day.
- (vi) Wages due to every worker shall be paid to him direct or to other person authorised by him in this behalf.
- (vii) All wages shall be paid in current coin or currency or inboth.
- (viii) Wages shall be paid without any deductions of any kind except those specified by the Central Government by general or special order in this behalf or permissible under the Payment of Wages Act1956.
- (ix) A notice showing the wages period and the place and time of disbursement of wages shall be displayed at the place of work and a copy sent by the contractor to the Engineer-in-Charge underacknowledgement.
- (x) It shall be the duty of the contractor to ensure the disbursement of wages in the presence of the Senior Superintendent Engg or authorised representative of the Engineer-in-Charge who will be required to be present at the place and time of disbursement of wages by the contractor toworkmen.

Note: In case of payment of wages paid through bank, the contractor shall submit a copy of bank statement for relevant period duly signed by him.

6. FINES AND DEDUCTIONS WHICH MAY BE MADE FROMWAGES

- (i) The wages of a worker shall be paid to him without any deduction of any kind except the following:
 - a) Fines

Appendix-XII.

- b) Deductions for absence from duty i.e. from the place or the places where by the terms of his employment he is required to work. The amount of deduction shall be in proportion to the period for which he wasabsent.
- c) Deduction for damage to or loss of goods expressly entrusted to the employed person for custody, or for loss of money or any other deduction which he is required to account, where such damage or loss is directly attributable to his neglect ordefault.
- d) Deduction for recovery of advances or for adjustment of overpayment of wages, advances granted shall be entered in aregister.
- e) Any other deduction which the Central Government may from time to timeallow.
- (ii) No fines should be imposed on any worker save in respect of such acts and omissions on his part as have been approved of by the Chief LaborCommissioner.Note: An approved list of Acts and Omissions for which fines can be imposed is enclosed at

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- (iii) No fine shall be imposed on a worker and no deduction for damage or loss shall be made from his wages until the worker has been given an opportunity of showing cause against such fines or deductions.
- (iv) The total amount of fine which may be imposed in any one wage period on a worker shall not exceed an amount equal to three paise in a rupee of the total wages, payable to him in respect of that wage period.
- (v) No fine imposed on any worker shall be recovered from him by installment, or after the expiry of sixty days from the date on which it wasimposed.
- (vi) Every fine shall be deemed to have been imposed on the day of the act or omission in respect. of which it wasimposed.

7. LABORRECORDS

- (i) The contractor shall maintain a Register of persons employed on work on contract in Form XIII of the CL(R&A) Central Rules 1971 (Appendix VI)
- (ii) The contractor shall maintain a Muster Roll register in respect of all workmen employed by him on the work under Contract in Form XVI of the CL (R&A) Rules 1971 (AppendixVII).
- (iii) The contractor shall maintain a Wage Register in respect of all workmen employed by himon the work under contract in Form XVII of the CL (R&A) Rules 1971 (AppendixVIII)
- (iv) **Register of accident** The contractor shall maintain a register of accidents in such form as may be convenient at the work place but the same shall include the following particulars:
 - (a) Full particulars of the Laborers who met withaccident.
 - (b) Rate of Wages
 - (c) Sex
 - (d) Age
 - (e) Nature of accident and cause ofaccident
 - (f) Time and date ofaccident
 - (g) Date and time when admitted in Hospital
 - (h) Date of discharge from the Hospital
 - (i) Period of treatment and result oftreatment
 - (j) Percentage of loss of earning capacity and disability as assessed by Medicalofficer
 - (k) Claim required to be paid under Workmen's CompensationAct.
 - (1) Date of payment of compensation
 - (m) Amount paid with details of the person to whom the same waspaid
 - (n) Authority by whom the compensation was assessed.
 - (o) Remarks
- (v) The contractor shall maintain a **Register of Fines** in the Form XII of the CL(R&A) Rules 1971(Appendix-XIII).
 - The contractor shall display in a good condition and in a conspicuous place of work the approved list of acts and omissions for which fines can be imposed (Appendix-XII)
- (vi) The contractor shall maintain a **Register of deductions for damage or loss** in Form XX of the CL (R&A) Rules 1971(Appendix-XIV)
- (vii) The contractor shall maintain a **Register of Advances** in Form XXIII of the CL (R&A) Rules 1971(Appendix-XV)
- (viii) The contractor shall maintain a **Register of Overtime** in Form XXIII of the CL (R&A) Rules 1971(Appendix-XVI).

8. ATTENDANCE CARD-CUM-WAGESLIP

- (i) The contractor shall issue an **Attendance card-cum-wage** slip to each workman employed by him in the specimen form at(Appendix-IX)
- (ii) The card shall be valid for each wageperiod.
- (iii) The contractor shall mark the attendance of each workman on the card twice each day, once at the commencement of the day and again after the rest interval, before he actually startswork.
- (iv) The card shall remain in possession of the worker during the wage period underreference.

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- (v) The contractor shall complete the wage slip portion on the reverse of the card at least a day prior to the disbursement of wages in respect of the wage period underreference.
- (vi) The contractor shall obtain the signature or thumb impression of the worker on the wage slip at the time of disbursement of wages and retain the card withhimself.

9. EMPLOYMENTCARD

The contractor shall issue an **Employment Card** in Form XIV of the CL (R&A) Central Rules 1971 to each worker within three days of the employment of the worker(Appendix-X).

10. SERVICECERTIFICATE

On termination of employment for any reason whatsoever the contractor shall issue to the workman whose services have been terminated, a **Service certificate** in Form XV of the CL(R&A) Central Rules 1971.

11. PRESERVATION OF LABORRECORDS

All records required to be maintained under Regulations Nos. 6 & 7 shall be preserved in original for a period of three years from the date of last entries made in them and shall be made available for inspection by the Engineer-in-Charge or Labor Officer or any other officers authorised by the Ministry of Urban Development in this behalf.

12. POWER OF LABOR OFFICER TO MAKE INVESTIGATIONS ORENQUIRY

The Labor Officer or any person authorised by Central Government on their behalf shall have power to make enquiries with a view to ascertaining and enforcing due and proper observance of Fair Wage Clauses and the Provisions of these Regulations. He shall investigate into any complaint regarding the default made by the contractor or subcontractor in regard to such provision.

13. REPORT OF LABOROFFICER

The Labor Officer or other persons authorised as aforesaid shall submit a report of result of his investigation or enquiry to the Engineer-in-Charge concerned indicating the extent, if any, to which the default has been committed with a note that necessary deductions from the contractor's bill be made and the wages and other dues be paid to the Laborers concerned. In case an appeal is made by the contractor under Clause 13 of these regulations, actual payment to Laborers will be made by the Engineer-in-Charge after G.M. Engg. has given his decision on such appeal.

(i) Engineer-in-Charge shall arrange payments to the Labor concerned within 45 days from the receipt of the report from the Labor Officer or the G.M. Engineer as the case maybe.

14. APPEAL AGAINST THE DECISION OF LABOROFFICER

Any person aggrieved by the decision and recommendations of the Labor Officer or other person so authorised may appeal against such decision to the Engineer-in-Charge concerned within 30 days from the date of decision, but subject to such appeal, the decision of the officer shall be final and binding upon the contractor.

15. PROHIBITION REGARDING REPRESENTATION THROUGHLAWYER

- (i) A workman shall be entitled to be represented in any investigation or enquiry under these regulations by:
- a) An officer of a registered trade union of which he is amember.
- b) An officer of a federation of trade unions to which the trade union referred to in Clause (a) is affiliated.



- c) Where the employer is not a member of any registered trade union, by an officer of a registered trade union, connected with the industry in which the worker is employed or by any other workman employed in the industry in which the worker isemployed.
- (ii) An employer shall be entitled to be represented in any investigation or enquiry under these regulations by:
- a) An officer of an association of employers of which he is amember.
- b) An officer of a federation of associations of employers to which association referred to in Clause(a) isaffiliated.
- c) Where the employers is not a member of any association of employers, by an officer of association of employer connected with the industry in which the employer is engaged or by any other employer, engaged in the industry in which the employer isengaged.
- (iii) No party shall be entitled to be represented by a legal practitioner in any investigation or enquiry under these regulations.

16. INSPECTION OF BOOKS ANDSLIPS

The contractor shall allow inspection of all the prescribed Labor records to any of his workers or to his agent at a convenient time and place after due notice is received or to the Labor Officer or any other person, authorised by the Central Government on his behalf.

17. SUBMISSION OFRETURNS

The contractor shall submit periodical returns as may be specified from time to time.

18. AMENDMENTS

The Central Government/AAI may from time to time add to or amend the regulations and on any question as to the application/interpretation or effect of those regulations the decision of the General Manager (Engg.) concerned shall be final.

The integrity pact shall be signed by both the parties in the following format

"This Pact made thisday of between Airports Authority of India, a body corporate constituted by the Central Government under the Airports Authority of India Act,1994 and having its Corporate Office at Rajiv Gandhi Bhawan, New Delhi, and offices atin India, hereinafter called the Authority (which term shall unless excluded by or is repugnant to the context, be deemed to include its Chairman, or Member, Executive Directors, Airport Directors, officers or any of them specified by the Chairman in this behalf, and shall also include its successors and assigns) of the onepart

AND

WHEREAS the Authority is desirous to make its business mechanism more transparent, thus to ensure strict adherence of the aforesaid objectives/goals, the Authority hereby adopts the instrument developed by the renowned international non-governmental organization "Transparency International" (T.I.) headquartered in Berlin (Germany). The Authority will appoint an Independent External Monitor (IEM) who will monitor the tender process and the execution of the contract for compliance with the principles mentioned above.

1. Commitments of the Authority;

- 1.1 The Authority undertakes that no official of the Authority, connected directly or indirectly with the contract, will demand, take a promise for or accept, directly or through intermediaries, any bribe, consideration, gift, reward, favour or any material or immaterial benefit or any other advantage from the BIDDER, either for themselves or for any person, organization or third party related to the contract in exchange for an advantage in the bidding process, bid evaluation, contracting or implementation process related to the contract.
- 1.2 The Authority will, during the pre-contact stage, treat all BIDDERs alike, and will provide to all BIDDERs the same information and will not provide any such information to any particular BIDDER which could afford an advantage to that particular BIDDER in comparison to other BIDDERs.
- 1.3 All the officials of the Authority will report to the appropriate authority office any attempted or completed breaches of the above commitments as well as any substantial suspicion of such abreach.
- In case any such preceding misconduct on the part of such official(s) is reported by the BIDDER to the Authority with full and verifiable facts and the same is prima facie found to be correct by the Authority, necessary disciplinary proceedings, or any other action as deemed fit, including criminal proceedings may be initiated by the Authority and such a person shall be debarred from further dealings related to the contract process. In such a case while an enquiry is being conducted by the Authority the proceedings under the contract would not bestalled.

1. Commitments of Bidders/Contractor.

The Bidder/Contractor commits itself to take all measures necessary to prevent corrupt practice, unfair means and illegal activities during any stage of its bid or during any pre-contract or post-contract stage in order to secure the contract or in furtherance to secure it and in particular commit itself to the following.

- The Bidder/Contractor will not offer, directly or through intermediaries, any bribe, gift, consideration, reward, favour, any material or immaterial benefit or other advantage, commission, fees, brokerage or inducement to any official of the Authority, connected directly or indirectly with the bidding process, or to any person, organization or third party related to the contract in exchange for any advantage in the bidding, evaluation, contracting and implementation of the contract.
- The Bidder/Contactor further undertakes that it has not given, offered or promised to give, directly or indirectly any bribe, gift, consideration, reward, favour, any material or immaterial benefit or other advantage, commission, fees, brokerage or inducement to any official of the Authority or otherwise in procuring the Contract or forbearing to do or having done any act in relation to the obtaining or executionofthecontractoranyothercontractwiththeAuthorityforshowingor

forbearing to show favour or disfavour to any person in relation to the contract or any other contract with the Authority.

- The Bidder / Contactor has not entered and will not enter with other bidders into any undisclosed agreement or understanding, whether formal or informal. This applies in particular to prices, specification, certifications, subsidiary contracts, submission or non-submission of bids or any actions to restrict competitiveness or to introduce cartelization in the biddingprocess.
- The Bidder/Contractor shall, when presenting his bid, disclose the name and address of agents and representatives and Indian BIDDERs shall disclose their foreign principals or associates.
- 25 The Bidder/Contactor shall when presenting his bid disclose any and all the payments he has made or, is committed to or intends to make to agents/brokers or any other intermediary, in connection with thisbid/contract.
- The Bidder/Contractor further confirms and declares to the Authority that the BIDDER is the original manufacturer/integrator/ authorized government sponsored export entity of the stores and has not engaged any individual or firm or company whether Indian or foreign to intercede, facilitate or in any way to recommend to the Authority or any of its functionaries, whether officially or unofficially to the award of the contract to the BIDDER, nor has any amount been paid, promised or intended to be paid to any such individual, firm or company in respect of any such intercession, facilitation orrecommendation.
- 2.7 The Bidder/Contractor, either while presenting the bid or during pre-contract negotiations or before signing the contract, shall disclose any payments he has made or has committed to or intends to make to officials of the Authority or their family members, agents, brokers or any other intermediaries in connection with the contract and the details of services agreed upon for suchpayments.
- The Bidder/Contractor will not collude with other parties interested in the contract to impair the transparency, fairness and progress of the bidding process, bid evaluation, contracting and implementation of the contract.
- 29 The Bidder/Contractor will not accept any advantage in exchange for any corrupt practice, unfair means and illegalactivities.
- The Bidder / Contactor shall not use improperly, for purposes of competition or personal gain ,or pass on to others, any information provided by the Authority as part of the business relationship, regarding plans, technical proposals and business details, including information contained in any electronic data carrier. The Bidder / Contractor also under takes to exercise due and adequate care lest any such information isdivulged.
- 2.11 The Bidder/Contractor will inform to the Independent External Monitor.
 - i) If he receives demand for an illegal/unduepayment/benefit.

- ii) If he comes to know of any unethical or illegalpayment/benefit.
- iii) If he makes any payment to any Authority'sassociate(s)
 - a. The Bidder/Contactor commits to refrain from giving any complaint directly or through any other manner without supporting it with full and verifiable facts.
 - b. The Bidder/Contactor shall not instigate or cause to instigate any third person to commit any of the actions mentionedabove.
 - c. If the Bidder/Contractor or any employee of the Bidder/Contractor or any person acting on behalf of the Bidder/Contractor, either directly or indirectly, is a relative of any of the officers of the Authority, or alternatively, if any relative of an officer of the Authority has financial interest/stake in the Bidder's/Contractor's firm, the same shall be disclosed by the Bidder/Contractor at the time filing of tender. The term 'relative' for this purpose would be as defined in Section 6 of the Companies Act1956.
 - d. The Bidder/Contractor shall not lend to or borrow any money from or enter into any monetary dealings or transactions, directly or indirectly, with any employee of the Authority.
 - e. That if the Bidder/ Contractor, during tender process or before the award of the contract or during execution of the contract/work has committed a transgression in violation of section 2 or in any other form such as to put his reliability or credibility as Bidder/Contractor into question, the Authority is entitled to disqualify him from the tender process or to terminate the contract for such reason and to debar the BIDDER from participating in future biddingprocesses.

1. Previous Transgression

- 3.1 The Bidder/Contractor declares that no previous transgression occurred in the last three years immediately before signing of this Integrity Pact, with any other company in any country in respect of any corrupt practices envisaged hereunder or with any Public Sector Enterprise in India or any Government Department in India that could justify Bidders's exclusion from the tenderprocess.
- 3.2 The Bidder/Contractor agrees that if it makes incorrect statement on this subject, he can be disqualified from the tender process or the contract, if already awarded, can be terminated for such reason and he may be considered for debarment for future tender/contractprocesses.
- 3.3 That the Bidder/Contractor undertakes to get this Pact signed by the subcontractor (s) and associate(s) whose value of the work contribution exceeds Rs 0.5 Cr. (Rupees zero point five Cr.) and to submit the same to the Authority along-with the tender document/contract before contractsigning.
- 3.4. That sub-contractor(s)/ associate(s) engaged by the Contractor, with the approval of the Authority after signing of the contract, and whose value of the work contributionexceedsRs0.5Cr.(RupeesZeropointfiveCr.)willberequiredto

sign this Pact by the Contractor, and the same will be submitted to the Authority before doing/ performing any act/ function by such subcontractor(s) / associate(s) in relation to the contract/ work.

- 3.5 That the Authority will disqualify from the tender process all Bidder(s) who don't sign this Pact or violate its provisions or fails to get this Pact signed in terms of policy of authority
- 3.6 That if the Contractor(s) does/ do not sign this Pact or violate its provisions or fails to get this Pact signed in terms of policy of authority. Authority will terminate the contract and initiate appropriate action against such Contractor(s).
- 4. Earnest Money, Security Deposit, Bank Guarantee, Draft, Pay order or any other mode and its validity i/c Warranty Period, Performance Guarantee/Bond.

While submitting bid, the BIDDER shall deposit an EMD/SD/BG/DRAFT/PAY ORDER ETC I/C WARRANTY PERIOD, PG/BOND, VALIDITY etc., which is as per terms and conditions and details given in NIT / tender documents sold to the Bidders.

- 5. Sanctions for Violations/Disqualification from tender process and exclusion from future Contacts.
- Any breach of the aforesaid provisions by the BIDDER or any one employed by it or acting on its behalf (whether with or without the knowledge of the BIDDER) shall entitle the Authority to take all or any one of the following actions, whereverrequired:
 - i) To immediately call off the pre contract negotiations without assigning any reason or giving any compensation to the BIDDER. However, the proceedings with the other BIDDER(s) wouldcontinue.
 - ii) To immediately cancel the contract, if already signed, without giving any compensation to the BIDDER.
 - iii) If the Authority has disqualified / debarred the Bidder from the tender process prior to the award under section 2 or 3 or 4, the Authority is entitled to forfeit the earnest money deposited/bidsecurity.
 - iv) To recover all sums already paid by the Authority, and in case of an Indian BIDDER with interest thereon at 2% higher than the prevailing Prime Lending Rate of State Bank of India, while in case of a BIDDER from a country other than India with interest thereon at 2% higher than the LIBOR. If any outstanding payment is due to the BIDDER from the Authority in connection with any other contract or any other stores, such outstanding payment could also be utilized to recover the aforesaid sum and interest.

- v) To en cash the advance bank guarantee and performance bond/warranty bond, if furnished by the BIDDER, in order to recover the payments, already made by the BUYER, along withinterest.
- vi) To cancel all or any other Contracts with the BIDDER. The BIDDER shall be liable to pay compensation for any loss or damage to the Authority resulting from such cancellation/rescission and the Authority shall be entitled to deduct the amount so payable from the money(s) due to the BIDDER.
- vii. To debar the BIDDER from participating in future bidding processes for a minimum period of three years, which may be further extended at the discretion of the Authority.
- viii. To recover all sums paid in violation of this Pact by BIDDER(s) to any middleman or agent or broker with a view to securing the contract.
- ix. In case where irrevocable Letters of Credit have been received in respect of any contract signed by the Authority with the BIDDER, the same shall not beopened.
- x. Forfeiture of Performance Bond in case of a decision by the BUYER to forfeit the same without assigning any reason for imposing sanction for violation of this Pact.
- xi. That if the Authority have terminated the contract under section 2 or 3 or 4 or if the Authority is entitled to terminate the contract under section 2 or 3 or 4, the Authority shall be entitled to demand and recover from the contractor damages equivalent to 5% of the contract value or the amount equivalent to security deposit or performance bank guarantee, whichever is higher.
- xii. That the Bidder / Contractor agrees and undertakes to pay the said amount without protest or demur subject only to condition that if the Bidder/Contractor can prove and establish to the satisfaction of the Authority that the disqualification / debarment of the bidder from the tender process or the termination of the contract after award of the contract has caused no damage to the Authority.

The Authority will be entitled to take allorany of the actions mentioned at para

5.2 above.

5.3 (i) to (xii) of this Pact also on the Commission by the BIDDER or any one employed by it or acting on its behalf (whether with or without the knowledge of the BIDDER), of an offence as defined in Chapter IX of the Indian Penal code, 1860 or Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 or any other statute enacted for prevention of corruption.

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- 5.4 That if the Bidder/Contractor applies to the Authority for premature revocation of the debarment and proves to the satisfaction of the Authority that he has installed a suitable and effective corruption prevention system and also restored/recouped the damage, if any, caused by him, the Authority may, if thinks fit, revoke the debarment prematurely considering the facts and circumstances of the case, and the documents/evidence adduced by the Bidder/Contractor for first timedefault.
- 5.5 That a transgression is considered to have occurred if the Authority is fully satisfied with the available documents and evidence submitted along with Independent External Monitor's recommendations/suggestions that no reasonable doubt is possible in thematter.
- 5.6 The decision of the Authority to the effect that a breach of the provisions of this Pact has been committed by the BIDDER shall be final and conclusive on the BIDDER. However, the BIDDER can approach the Independent External Monitor(s) appointed for the purpose of this Pact.

6 Allegations against Bidders/Contractors/ Sub-Contractors/Associates:

That if the Authority receives any information of conduct of a Bidder/Contractor or Sub-Contractor or of an employee or a representative or an associate of the Bidder, Contractor or Sub-Contractor which constitute corruption, or if the Authority has substantive suspicion in this regard, the Authority will inform the Vigilance Department for appropriate action.

7 Independent ExternalMonitor(s),

- 7.1. That the Authority has appointed competent and credible Independent External Monitor(s) for this Pact.
- 7.2 The task of the Monitor(s) is to review independently and objectively, whether and to what extent the parties comply with the obligations under this Pact. He will also enquire into any complaint alleging transgression of any provision of this Pact made by the Bidder, Contractor or Authority.
- 7.3. That the Monitor(s) is not subject to any instructions by the representatives of the parties and would perform his functions neutrally and independently. He will report to the Chairperson of the Board of the Authority.
- 7.4 That the Bidder / Contractor accepts that the Monitor(s) has the right to access without restriction to all project documentation of the Authority including that provided by the Bidder/Contractor. The Bidder/Contractor will also grant the Monitor, upon his request and demonstration of a valid interest, unrestricted and unconditional access to his project documentation including minutes of meeting. The same is applicable to Sub Contractors and Associates. The Monitor is under obligation to treat the information and documents of the Authority and Bidder/Contractor / Sub Contractors / Associates withconfidentiality.
- 7.5. That as soon as the Monitor notices, or believes to notice, a violation of this Pact, hewillsoinformthemanagementoftheAuthorityandrequestthemanagement

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to discontinue or heal the violation, or to take other relevant action. The Monitor(s) can in this regard submit his recommendations/ suggestions. Beyond this, the Monitor(s) has no right to demand from the parties that they act in a specific manner, refrain from action or tolerate action.

- 7.6 That the Authority will provide to the Monitor(s) sufficient information about all meetings among the parties related to the project provided such meetings could have an impact on the contractual relations between the Authority and the Contractor / Bidder. The parties offer to the Monitor(s) the option to participate in such meetings.
- 7.7 That the Monitor(s) will submit a written report to the Chairperson of the Board of the Authority within 2 weeks from the date of reference or intimation to him by the Authority and, should the occasion arise, submit proposals for correcting problematicsituations.
- 7.8 That if the Monitor(s) has reported to the Chairperson of the Board a substantiated suspicion of an offence under relevant Anti Corruption Laws of India and the Chairperson has not, within reasonable time, taken visible action to proceed against such offence or reported it to the Vigilance Department, the Monitor may also transmit this information directly to the Central Vigilance Commissioner, Government of India.
- 7.9 The word 'Monitor' would include singular and plural.

8 Facilitation of Investigation.

In case of any allegation of violation of any provisions of this Pact or payment of commission, the Authority or its agencies shall be entitled to examine all the documents including the Books of Accounts of the BIDDER and the BIDDER shall provide necessary information and documents in English and shall extend all possible help for the purpose of suchExamination.

9 Law and Place of Jurisdiction.

That this Pact is subject to provisions under Indian Law. The place of performance and jurisdiction is the Corporate Headquarter/the Regional Headquarter/office of the Authority, asapplicable.

10 Other LegalActions

- 10.1That the changes and supplements as well as termination notice need to be made inwriting.
- 10.2That if the Bidder / Contractor are a partnership or a consortium, this Pact must be signed by all the partners and consortium members or their authorized representatives.



Provided that if any intermediate payments are made to the Contractor on account of work done than on the occasion of each such payment the AAI will be at liberty to make a recovery from the Contractor's bill for such payment by deducting there from the value of the said materials then actually used in the construction and in respect of which recovery has not been made previously, the value for this purpose being determined in respect of each description of materials at the rates at which the amounts of the advances made under these presents were calculated.
- (7) That if the Contractor shall at any time make any default in the performance or observance in any respect of any of the terms and provisions of the said agreement or of these presents the total amount of the advance or advances that may still be owing to the AAI shall immediately on the happening of such default be repayable by the Contractor to the President together with interest thereon at twelve per cent per annum from the date or respective dates of such advance or advances to the date of repayment and with all costs charges, damages and expenses incurred by the President in or for the recovery thereof or the enforcement of this security or otherwise by reason of the default of the Contractor and the Contractor hereby covenants and agrees with the President to repay and pay the same respectively to him accordingly.
- (a) Size and utilize the said materials or any part thereof in the completion of the said works on behalf of the Contractor in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said agreement debiting the Contractor with the actual cost of effecting such completion and the amount due in respect of advances under these presents and crediting the Contractor with the value of work done as if he had carried it out in accordance with the said agreement and at the rates thereby provided. If the balance is against the Contractor, he is to pay same to the AAI on demand.
- (b) Remove and sell by public auction the seized materials or any part thereof and out of the moneys arising from the sale retain all the sums aforesaid repayable or payable to the AAI under these presents and pay over the surplus (if any) to the Contractor. Deduct all or any part of the moneys owing out of the security deposit or any sum due to the Contractor under the said agreement.
- (9) That except in the event of such default on the part of the Contractor as aforesaid interest on the said advance shall not be payable.
- (10)That in the event of any conflict between the provisions of these presents and the said agreement the provisions of these presents shall prevail and in the event of any dispute or difference arising over the construction or effect of these presents the settlement of which has not

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been herein before expressly provided for the same shall be finally resolved as per provisions of clause 25 of the contract.

SPECIAL CONDITION OF CONTRACT (SCC)

SPECIAL CONDITION OF CONTRACT FOR GENERAL MAINTENANCE AND MONITORING OF AIRPORT SYSTEMS INSTALLATIONS AVAILABLE AT AURANGABAD AIRPORT.

These special conditions of contract shall be read in conjunction with Airports Authority of India General conditions of contract, if there are any provisions in the special conditions of contract which are at variance with the provisions of general conditions of contract, the provision in these special conditions shall take precedence.

1. General Scope of Work: - The Scope of work cover the following items: -

Providing monitoring, cleaning, minor repairs, general maintenance and operation support (as required) for various installations related to Airport systems (Passenger facilitations and Airport security in compliance with BCAS guidelines) at Aurangabad Airport.

Area to be covered under the scope of this contract:

Operational Area, City side area, Terminal Building, ATC Tower, CARGO Building etc of Aurangabad Airport.

Scope of Work:

- Day to day testing of installations and equipments as per OEM guidelines / AAI instructions in compliance to BCAS guidelines prior to handing over of the systems for operation to ASG-CISF/ Stake holders / personnel authorized for operations.
- Ensuring serviceability and providing day to day general maintenance activities such as cleaning, dusting and other preventive maintenance works as per maintenance schedule of various Airport system installations at Aurangabad Airport as mentioned in the ANNEXUREs.
- Monitoring, addressing, reporting of breakdown of any installations to concerned OEM/ representative over phone/ What's App/ E-mail to concerned agencies/ personnel for attending the same. Recording of complaints, necessary follow ups till closure of complaints/ restoring the serviceability of the systems followed by update of reports in complaint register and electronic platform.
- ➤ Taking proper care during execution of works, ensure safety, ensure cyber security, ensure integrity and secrecy of Airport security as well as installations, keeping the work premises neat & clean, proper disposal of waste (as per statutory norms), clear of debris, removing of dirt & stains, spillage, accounting of materials (serviceable and un-serviceable spares, instruments, consumables etc.).
- Shall coordinate with CSO/ Security departments/ stake holders/ other associated departments of AAI to ensure smooth and safe operations and passengers' movement.
- Shall coordinate with different agencies/ appropriate authorities during replacement /minor modification works & wiring works

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- related to various Airport system installations and monitoring the same.
- Maintaining all records, preventative maintenance schedule log book, Inventory register, breakdown register for day to day activities and prepare necessary documentation as per BCAS/regulatory authorities' guidelines throughout the contract period in coordination with Security department, CISF-ASG / State Police and concerned Airlines including submission of daily status report of various Airport system installations.
- Contractor/ agency has to arrange his own tools and plants including ladders, cleaning equipments and material handling devices required for maintenance purpose which are inclusive and nothing extra will be paid for the same.
- During the contract period if any new installations are added / replaced or modified to the existing ones, will not warrant any additional manpower and no extra payment will be entertained.
- Supply of Spares as and when required only after approval of sample by E-I-C.
- > Supply and laying of Anti Rodent CAT-6 & OFC Cable including termination as per site requirement.
- > Providing and making Splicing connection of OFC cable as per requirement.
- Providing necessary support for shifting or relocating the existing FIDS/CIDS display/monitors / CCTV cameras/ X-BIS/ DFMD/ ETD/ BDDS equipments / Batteries/ UPS / PA system components etc. as per requirement including modification of mounting brackets/ channel (if required) etc as directed by E-I-C.
- Monitoring the validity of all software and intimate to E-I-C or his/ her authorized representative well in advance (at least 60 days before expiry), failing which necessary expenditure and arrangement will be borne by the agency.

Manpower: The firm has to depute following minimum manpower (for all days including Saturday, Sunday & Other Gazetted Holidays) during the entire period of contract. Provision of weekly off to the workers is mandatory. The cost of the below manpower will be considered by the bidder in the quoted cost.

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2. Period of Contract: -

The service contract shall be for a period of **24 months** from the date of handing over of site. The contract period can be extended for further period of 06 months on the same terms and conditions of the agreement. AAI reserves the right to terminate the contract fully or partially by giving 30 days' notice in writing to the contractor. If in the opinion of the Engineer-In-Charge, it is observed that the contractor is not doing the works satisfactorily as per the terms and conditions of contract, then the contract can be terminated with immediate effect without giving any reasons thereof.

3. Entry Pass: -

The work site lies in restricted area. The contractor shall apply in writing in advance for issue of necessary entry passes of workmen engaged by him. The office/airport premises is an essential service covered under the maintenance of essential service Act and hence, disruption of services rendered will be a statutory offence. The necessary police verification etc. as required for entry passes will be the responsibility of the contractor. All expenditure towards arranging security passes shall be borne by the Agency. BCAS rules and guidelines shall be implemented as applicable throughout the contract period.

The Contractor shall fulfill the following requirements which are mandatory for obtaining Aerodrome Entry Permits (AEPs) prior to the commencement of work at Airport:

- a) The Contractor shall obtain Security Clearance (through E-sahaj portal of Govt. ofIndia/ link via BCAS website) for the Company from Bureau of Civil Aviation Security (BCAS). The Contractor shall obtain the approval of Entity's Security Programme from BCAS.
- b) The Contractor shall undertake Police Background Checks of the employees recruited and obtain Police Verification Certificate (PVC) from concerned Police Commissioner in respect of their employees (PVC obtained by the individual prior to the employment is not valid). Background checks shall be conducted at all the places of the applicant's residence in the previous one year and of his criminal history, if any. A valid Indian Passport issued in the previous 05 years shall be considered in lieu of background check, provided there is no change in the residential address.
- c) After obtaining Police Verification Certificate, the Contractor shall ensure that their employees shall attend one-day Aviation Security (AVSEC) Awareness Training Programme available online in the website. https://iaaweb.dhanushinfotech.com/

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d) If Contractor is found to violate any of Security Regulations, he shall be black listedand will be subjected to other legal proceedings.

4. Security: -

The contractor and his employees shall abide by security regulation framed by AAI/BCAS or Police Authorities. Any worker of the contractor, whose presence is found undesirable in AAI premises, shall not be allowed to work. The Contractor shall be fully responsible for the satisfactory working of his staff.

"If Contractor or his authorized representative or his employed workers are found violating any of security regulations, person concerned should be immediately replaced, AEP to be surrendered and appropriate / suitable action shall be taken by AAI as per prevailing rules of BCAS / statutory authorities guidelines, Please note that the E-I-C has the complete right to surrender the AEP of any employee for the misbehavior and agency has to take strict action".

All men/ women and vehicles shall be permitted to enter the restricted / office area only on possession of the security passes/ permits. Passes shall be deposited back to Engineer-In-Charge on demand/ immediately after completion of work. The contractor or his staff shall observe all the rules promulgated from time to time by the concerned authorities. Any person found violating the security rules laid down by the authority will be expelled from the area without assigning any reason whatsoever and contractor shall have no claim on this account.

Security clearance, approval for security programme, tools permit and obtaining entry passes from BCAS is mandatory for carrying out the work in the airport and the successful bidder shall be required to obtain the same from BCAS within a month of start of the contract. All required documents, fee etc. shall be prepared and furnished to the concerned authorities by the contractor for permanent/provisional /temporary passes/permits/clearance etc. The onus to obtain such permits, passes, clearance, authorization etc. lies with the contractor

5. Statutory & Regulatory Clauses: -

The contractor has to discharge all the obligations as provided under various statutory enactment including the EPF/ ESI/ Contract Labour (Regulation and abolition)/ Minimum Wages / Payment of Wages / Payment of Bonus /Payment of Gratuity / Workmen's compensation / Works Contract and other relevant Acts, Rules and Regulations in force and as amended from time to time in the State, as applicable.

The engagement and employment of workers and payment of wages to them as per existing provisions of various labour laws and regulations is the sole responsibility of the contractor and any breach of such laws or regulations shall be deemed to be violation of this contract. AAI may ask the contractor to produce documents to verify that these provisions/laws are compiled by the contractor.

The contractor has to follow the local security/safety rules & regulations and such instructions on restricted hours of work as may be imposed on him by

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the department / local authorities, while working in security restricted zones and no claim whatsoever on account of this, will be entertained.

The contractor has to deploy their staff to run the system on all days (365 days) including Sundays and Gazetted holidays as per "manpower" clause for which nothing extra shall be paid.

Contractor has to submit the details of staff such as qualification documents and experience certificates of the staff, the CV and passport size coloured photograph along with copy of police verification (not older than six months on the date of start of work) / as per guidelines of regulatory authorities before engaging them on work. All the documents should be self-attested by each worker and counter signed & stamped by contractor/ agency.

The decision of Engineer-In-Charge, to accept or reject any candidate on the basis of lack of experience, qualification, lack of skills required for job, will be final and binding on the Agency.

6. Uniform: -

The contractor/ agency has to provide every year during the currency of the contract. 2 sets of uniform (pant and shirt), 1 pair of ISI marked safety shoes (computer operator only may be provided formal office foot wear) & 2 pair of socks, a rain coat, a gum boot, umbrella (as station comes under rain fall area) and a sweater to his staff of approved colour during the contract period (within one month from the date of award) failing which, AAI shall recover an amount of **Rs. 200/- per person per week** till the compliance of the same from the contractors running/final bill, in the event of non-compliance of wearing uniform & ISI marked safety shoe by workers on daily basis a recovery of **Rs. 50/-per day per person** shall be made from running bills. The workers should wear a badge on the left pocket of the shirt mentioning their company's name. Each employee should be provided with suitable photo ID card with agency's tag which should be worn with AEP.

- **7.** No accommodation shall be arranged by the AAI for the staff / workers of the contractor. It is the responsibility of contractor to make his own arrangements for the facilities.
- **8. Rates: -** The prices quoted shall be inclusive of minimum wage, cost of uniform & Shoes and GST taxes but exclusive of Employer contribution towards EPF/ ESI (as applicable) or premium value of Mediclaim policy (as applicable) & Bonus. Employer contribution towards PF & ESI amount of engaged manpower paid to the statutory authorities by the contractor shall be reimbursed on actual basis throughout the contract period on submission of the documentary evidence in next bill or after the final bill.
- a) Bonus amount as per latest Govt. or minimum 8.33% of annual wages, whichever is higher will be paid to all manpower deployed against said contract/agreement, preferably on monthly basis (i.e. proportionate amount of bonus on monthly wages along with salary) by the contractor and the same shall be reimbursed on actual basis on submission of the documentary evidence in next bill or after the completion of contract within one month.

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- b) However, the deployed manpower drawing/getting monthly wages more than monthly cut-off limit for bonus eligibility (if any) shall be paid bonus @8.33% of annual wages worked out restricted to monthly upper wage cut-off limit for bonus eligibility notified by GoI from time to time, and same shall be reimbursed by AAI on actual basis on submission of the documentary evidence.
- c) In case of nonpayment of bonus necessary recovery/ withheld against bonus from their RA Bill/ Final bill shall be made as decided by EIC and appropriate action will be initiated by AAI against the contractor. The decision of EIC in this regard shall be final and binding on the Agency.

9. PF & ESIC Contribution: -

- i. The contractor shall register himself with Labour Licensing Authority and obtain Labour License Number in this regard.
- ii. The contractor shall have to register with PF & ESIC (where ever applicable) for workmen engaged for the work & challans / deposit receipts of PF & ESI contribution shall be submitted in AAI office for verification/reimbursement, at the time of submission of bill.
- iii. The PF dues (including EDLI and administrative charges) in respect of workers engaged by the contractor for AAI works to be deposited by the contractor every month by a challan and the documentary evidence in support of such payments along-with employee wise details of the PF contribution (both Employee's share and the employer's contribution) needs to be submitted to the Engineer in charge for the work/ contract.
- iv. ESI (where ever applicable) & EPF amount (contractor's contribution & administrative charges) paid to the statutory authorities by the contractor shall be reimbursed on actual basis on submission of documentary evidence.
- v. If ESI not applicable, the agency shall provide Rs. 2.0 lakhs Mediclaim policy against each person engaged at the site. The premium towards the same shall not be reimbursed by AAI.
- vi. The contractor has to deposit PF & ESI as applicable, failing which recovery/ withheld@ 26 % and 6 % against PF and ESI respectively from their R.A bills/ Final Bill shall be made.

10. Labour Wages:

i. The contractor has to pay the prevailing minimum wages issued by the office of Regional Labour Commissioner/ Chief Labour Commissioner (whichever is higher), from time to time. However, the difference in minimum wages based on actual payment made to the labour and wages applicable at the time of submission of tender will be reimbursed including difference in EPF and ESI payment to the contractor on revision of minimum wages and no additional amount such as contractor's overhead & profit will be paid on this account.

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The labour wages at the time of submission of tender:

Category of labour	Rates of wages including V.D.A. per day applicable for Aurangabad Airport (in Rupees)
Skilled	876.68
Un-Skilled	777.07

In this regard the successful bidder shall submit an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper of Rs.100 as per Annexure before award of the work.

- ii. For the purpose of admitting the claim for reimbursement of statutory increase in wages paid by him, the contractor has to produce the required documentary evidence to the satisfaction of Engineer-In-Charge.
- iii. The payment to the workmen's engaged by the contractor is to be paid through NEFT/RTGS/ Cheque on or before 7th of every month irrespective of Saturday, Sunday and bank holidays. If any violation with respect to payment of wages for any two months in a contract period, necessary action for cancellation of contract, debarring of the agency for participating in future contracts in AAI shall be initiated. The agency will not be allowed to participate in any of the tendering process in AAI till finalization of the decision.

11. Location and inspection of site

The work is to be carried out at different locations at Aurangabad Airport. The tenderer is advised to inspect the installation to understand the nature of services to be rendered and the extent of installations before submitting their tender. However, once the tender is submitted, it will be deemed that the tenderer has full knowledge of the site and no plea based on lack of site situation knowledge will be entertained under any circumstances

12. Mode of Instruction:

The instructions on day to day execution of the work can be either in written form or through other means including oral, from AAI passed to the supervisor or any other representative of the contractor including any workmen. The written instructions may be by way of letter, email, endorsement on site order book, log books, complaint register or any other document. The instructions so issued shall be construed as having issued to the contractor by AAI. These instructions shall be limited to the day to day maintenance related activities and in all other cases; the provisions in the GCC 2017 shall be adhered to

13. Duty Roster of the Workmen Deployed by The Contractor:

AAI will have powers to dictate, correct and accept the duty roster of the workmen deployed by the contractor. And upon such acceptance by AAI, no change in the duty roster shall be made without the written consent of AAI failing which the altered duties will not be counted for measurement. In this regard AAI can demand submission of duty roster for the future

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period, 15 days in advance and ask for corrections if it to the opinion of AAI is required which is final and binding

14. Biometric Attendance System (BAS):

The agency shall provide biometric attendance system in addition to legacy registers on its own cost for all staff deployed at site. Monitoring report shall be submitted along with the monthly running bills or time intervals as decided by the EIC. In case the agency fails to provide BAS, a penalty of Rs 1000/- per month will be deducted from the running bills. In case of the BAS system found to be faulty on non-functional, same shall be reinstated within 07 days. For each day beyond this, pro-rata of the above-mentioned penalty will be levied from the agency. **The agency has to provide BAS system at Terminal Building/ City Side Area.**

15. MAINTENANCE DOCUMENTATION:

The different documents such as logbooks, preventive maintenance registers (as per PVM schedule which may be revised from time to time), Breakdown register, Inventory register and complaint books etc. shall be maintained by the Contractor as required by AAI. The Contractor also shall provide the required stationeries for this purpose. The Contractor shall carry out the documentation related to the work and furnish the same to AAI. The documents shall be the property of AAI.

- **16. Qualification & Wages of Staff: -** The contractor should depute the persons as per the qualification given below for maintenance works: -
- 1. **Skilled manpower** Shall have Graduate or Diploma degree in Electronics/Computer-Application or Electrical with minimum 01-year experience shall be paid as per minimum wages.
- 2. **Helper -** Shall be minimum VIIIth Class pass with good physique & shall have basic knowledge of similar works and shall be paid as per minimum wages.
 - **17.** In case of absence of staff from duty recovery will be made by the department at the following rates, which shall be binding on the contractor.

i) Skilled : As per prevailing daily wagesii) Semi-Skilled : As per prevailing daily wages

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But apart from daily wages, an amount of Rs. 200/- will be recovered from the agency per person per shift for absenteeism of any worker as a penalty in case of BOQ item is under execution.

The EIC has full rights to instruct the agency of expel/ replace the person with the regular habit of taking unauthorized leaves frequently or continuously absent without proper justification, which may impact the morale of co-workers.

- 18. The complete details of the Airport system Installations under the scope of work are attached in Annexure "A" and Preventive Maintenance Schedule in Annexure "B". Any other activity related to Airport system shall be added as per site requirements and as per instructions of E-I-C. Nothing extra payment will be made in this regard.
- 19. It is the responsibility of the contractor to maintain and ensure 100% serviceability of the equipment's / installations under this contract except for the reasons beyond the control of the contractor. The decision of Engineer-In-Charge is final and binding on the contractor in respect of establishment & the reason beyond the control of the contractor. If the failure to maintain the serviceability of installations attributed to the contractors / agency, penalty to be imposed on the contractor as deemed fit by the Engineer in Charge.
- 20. In case the agency is not able to attend/ rectify faults in the system within the stipulated time period, AAI reserves the rights to engage outside agency to check / inspect the faulty system. If the system is rectified by the outside agency or third party, the amount of checking, rectification along with suitable penalty towards delay in attending breakdown shall be recovered from the agency who otherwise is responsible for the up keeping of this equipment.
- **21.** There shall be no liability on the part of the AAI to pay any compensation arising out of the labour dispute, accident etc. at site. The contractor will be fully responsible for safety, security and coordination of the workers deployed at AAI site. Noting extra will be paid to the Agency on this account.
- **22.** Contractor or his authorized representative shall visit the site at least once in one month and as and when called by the Engineer-In-Charge or his representative and will report about satisfactory working of all equipment.
- **23.** Any material taken out for the purpose of repair/ rectification/ replacement from the building or work premises shall have necessary permission from the EIC and security personnel/ competent authority in the form of a Gate pass.

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- **24.** The timings of operation & maintenance/ upkeep work etc. shall be as decided by Engineer-In-Charge from time to time depending upon operational & technical requirement.
- **25.** If agency is doing any maintenance work as per schedule, then they have to take prior approval for the same from EIC and also have coordination with other entities/ wings (ATC/CNS/Airlines etc.) as required.

26. Handing/ Taking over of the Equipment: - i. For AMC Contract

All the equipment's / installations/ systems with accessories complete in all respect shall be checked by agency before taking over the site and the same has to be handed over AAI contractor in good running condition at the end of the contract. List of defects, if any, notified during contract period shall be rectified by the agency before the closure of the contract. If the agency failed to rectify the defects, notified to him (during contract period) the EIC shall rectified the defects at the contractor's risk & cost. The decision of EIC in this regard will be final & binding on the agency.

27. For delay in attending maintenance schedules: -

It is the responsibility of the contractor to maintain and ensure 100% serviceability of the equipment's / installations under this contract, except for the reasons beyond the control of the contractor. The decision of Engineer-In-Charge is final and binding on the contractor in respect of establishment & "the reason beyond the control of the contractor". If the failure to maintain the serviceability of installations attributed to the contractors / agency, penalty to be imposed on the contractor as deemed fit by the Engineer in Charge.

All the preventive maintenance works shall be done as per preventive maintenance schedule and complete records in those regards has to be prepared and submitted to AAI at the end of every month, failing which a recovery of Rs. 5,000/- per month shall be made from the bills for each sub system of installations, subject to the shutdown provided by AAI, which shall be Co- ordinated by the agency. Note: In any case the total penalty at any point of time on account of any or all the categories put together shall not exceed 10 % of the total contract value.

- 28. The contractor has to deploy their staff to run the system on all days as per Manpower clause. If there are some labours under a court case, that needs to be deployed by the agency as directed by EIC.
- **29.** The work shall be carried out as per specifications and relevant applicable standard including ISI/CPWD specification/ OEM standard / BCAS norms/ statutory Regulation.

30. Safety & availability of Material: -

i. The firm/agency shall submit test certificates, wherever applicable as per CPWD/IS/manufacturers practice as and when required only after approval of sample by E-I-C and the department reserves the right to

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get them independently checked for the material supplied by contractor as required.

- ii. All debris due to works shall be removed and site shall be cleared by the contractor as soon as the task is completed. Non-removal of debris from site will attract a penalty of Rs. 500/- per day from the running bill/final bill.
- iii. Issue of materials stipulated in the tender will be regulated to the actual needs from time to time. Un-used materials shall be returned to the department failing which the recovery will be made at the penal rate i.e. double the market rate. Any damage caused to the materials during transit or under storage will be to the contractor's account.
- iv. If there is any requirement of material at site which is not available in AAI store, then contractor has to procure from market as per approved makes with EIC permission and close the complaint as soon as possible. Contractor will provide the tax invoice/ bill for the same and the payment for such material will be given along with 15% OH & CP in running / final bill as an extra item.

31. Guarantee: -

In case of supply of any material, the tenderer shall guarantee the equipment material against all defects as per manufacturer. Any defects arising during the guarantee period shall be rectified by the Tenderer at his own expenses to the satisfaction of the E-I-C.

- **32. Water. Electricity and Enquiry Room: -**The AAI will provide an enquiry room, water & electricity for maintenance purpose, free of cost.
- **33. Make of items: -** The contractor shall use / supply the material as per approved make of AAI or as per schedule of quantities or exact replacement of existing material suitable to site after taking permission from EIC in writing and the department reserves the right to accept or reject any other makes offered by the contractor.

The contractor has to supply the materials as and when required only after approval of sample by E-I-C during the currency of the contract.

34. Terms of payment: -

The Running payments for the work done shall be released Bi-Monthly by AAI only after salary payments to all workers & submitting the proof of disbursement and deducting the applicable taxes. The Security Deposit @ 10% shall be deducted from the running bills, which shall be released after successful completion of Defects Liability Period.

The following documents as applicable shall be produced and self-attested photo copy shall be submitted by the contractor during each running bills:-

- i. Delivery challan / copy of invoice of all the material supplied.
- ii. Monthly Challans of E.P.F. and E.S.I. deposits up to previous month.
- iii. Wages register signed by workers of each month.
- iv. Bonus details received and signed by workers.
- v. Log books & Biometric Attendance register.

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Final Bill Payment: -The total amount of final bill worked out at the accepted tender rates, if found to be more than the amount worked out at the quoted rate of second lowest, the contractor shall be paid lower of the two.

The agency shall submit final bill along with all the documents related with PF, ESIC & Bonus to AAI in addition to all maintenance schedule registers, documents etc. related to the work. The agency also formally handed over the list of equipment's in good working condition, without any damage as handed over to them by AAI.

On implementation of GST, Payment against CPWD DSR item shall be made to the contractor after making adjustment/ corrections of inbuilt component of taxes in DSR rate during the billing as per prevailing rules/ orders issued by AAI or competent authority.

- **35. Defects Liability Period:** Six (Six) Months from the date of actual date of completion of work.
- **36.** The contractor shall be responsible for any damage caused to any equipment's /building of AAI due to the negligence of the staff. The same shall be made good by the contractor at his cost.
- **37. Agency** has to submit the Preventive Maintenance Activity Plan within 15 days of award of work in line with the Preventive Maintenance Schedule, considering site requirement for approval of Engineer-In-Charge or his authorized representative.
- **38.** The agency shall provide **01 no. mobile phone** with active SIM to the site in charge/authorized representative for official use during the currency of the contract, nothing extra will be paid on this account. Failing which, an amount **of Rs. 50/- per day per phone** will be recovered as penalty from running bill.

39. Dismantled materials:

- i. The contractor shall make entry of all the materials issued for the work, time to time in the material issue register (to be separately maintained by the contractor).
- ii. After completion of the work necessary entries shall also be made in the register indicating the location where the materials are installed and the balance materials left out need to deposited to AAI store after completion of work.
- iii. The dismantled materials shall be duly handed over to Engineer in charge or his authorized representative and necessary endorsement shall be obtained in both material issue register and also the dismantled material register.

40. Equipment's For Night Working:

In case, it appears, at any stage that the work may not be completed within the stipulated period due to restricted working hours in the day in view of any reasons, the contractor shall execute the work during the night as and when

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required. Nothing extra shall be payable to contractor for working in night time.

41. Consumables: - All the consumables such as insulation tape, Test Lamps, cotton waste, soap, dusters, grease, Petroleum jelly, hack-saw blade, CTC, CRC, Alcholic CLEANER etc. will be provided by the contractor, Stationeries such as log books, work diaries to workmen, printed maintenance records, logbook of various installations, various registers, preventive maintenance schedules as per AAI format and as per the instructions of Engineer-In-Charge will be provided within the 15 days of award of contract and maintained by the contractor at the site. Reserve Stock quantity to be decided by the EIC & nothing extra payment will be made in this regard and the agency has to keep minimum quantity of consumables for Two months in stock depending on the actual requirement failing which the material will be arranged by the AAI and the expenditure will be recovered from the agency with 15% over head.

42. Tools and Tackles:

The contractor shall provide all the tools and tackles for the works including Measuring instruments and safety gadgets for attending breakdown of equipment's. Cost of transportation of labour and material to Airport/ office premises shall have to be borne by the contractor.

Each Skilled manpower will be provided with minimum one set of following tools of reputed brand (Make: Taparia or equivalent) along with carrying bag for routine maintenance works: -

- CRIMPING TOOL FOR LAN CABLE-01 no

- Nose pliers
 One Number.

- Allen key set suitable for the existing Airport system (1 to 9 mm)
 One set each type
- Multi-meter (VAO Meter): One Number
- Megger (500 V) 2 sets
- Earth Tester-Two Number
- Clamp-on-meter- 2 sets

The following tackles shall be provided by agency for routine maintenance works:

A type FRP LADDER of min 15 ft height -01 no

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- LED type portable search Light (Rechargeable)-min 02 nos
- Hammers : One Number.
- Heavy duty Drilling One number with all types of drill bits.
- Safety Gloves 2 sets
- Safety Helmet- 2 sets
- Safety Belt-1 set
- Light duty Drilling Machine One number with all types of drill bits
- Blower Two Number.
- Industrial Vacuum Cleaner (Big size) : One Number
- Spirit Level : One Number
- Soldering Iron: Two Number

NOTE: All the tool, tackles, instruments shall be provided new and same are returnable. The safe custody of above all tools are lying with Contractor. All meters (Multimeter, IR Megger, Earth Megger, Clamp meter etc.) shall have valid calibration certificate. Calibration to be carried out after the completion of one year for Meggar, Earth Tester and Clamp On Meter.

Compensation @ Rs. 500.00/ tool/ day will be made for not having the above tools and tackles. The compensation shall be recovered from the contractor's bill. The Supervisor shall submit the list of tools available and its serviceability status every month to the EIC or his authorized representative.

43. Guidance to Tenderer:

The contractor shall quote the tender based on the expenditure towards providing of manpower (based on minimum wages), Uniform to workers, Tool & Tackles, Statutory items, premium cost towards Medi-claim policy, PIC Charges, Cost of consumables, miscellaneous expenses, taxes & duties etc.

44. Penalty Clause:

No total Breakdown is acceptable, in case of total break down due to negligence of the contractor or his workmen, suitable recovery proposed by Engineer-In-Charge will be final and binding on the contractor. Special care is required in attending the faults for the equipment where no standby is available.

Note: In any case the total penalty at any point of time on account of any or all the categories put together shall not exceed 15 % of the total contract value per month.

If any equipment damaged due to the negligence of the manpower, the agency shall repair the same and nothing extra shall be paid on this account by the AAI. Once the total penalty reaches this limit, the contract shall be liable for review / rescind as per the provisions of the contract agreement and the decision of Engineer-In-Charge in this regard shall be final and binding on the contractor.

45. First Aid and Fire Safety Training:

Agency has to arrange training programs for the workmen on <u>First Aid</u> and <u>Fire Safety</u> through Red Cross/ concerned Govt Authorised training agency once in each year. The cost of the same will be reimbursed to agency on submission of the bills along with training certificates.

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46. Additional payment to worked on National Holiday:

Agency has to pay additional per day wage to the worker deputed for performing duty on 03 occasions (26th January, 15th August and 2nd October) being National Holiday as per statutory requirement. Agency may consider the same while quoting the financial bid. No extra amount shall be reimbursed towards performing duty on 03 occasions.

47. BA TEST

Staff / Workmen deployed under the contract will be liable for carrying out BA test before commencement of work on daily basis. If Staff / Workmen is failed in that test, agency must replace the staff with another person.
